

Federal Jury Queries 6 On Recent Cuban Visit

Six witnesses were questioned in Brooklyn yesterday as a Federal grand jury began investigating student travel to Cuba.

United States Attorney Joseph P. Hoey said another session would be held next Tuesday.

There were reports that a number of witnesses had refused to answer some questions, acting under the Fifth Amendment's guarantee against self-incrimination.

The jury was believed to be acting under Section 1185, Title 8, of the United States Code. This section prohibits entry or departure from the United States except under "reasonable" rules prescribed by the President.

Milton Rosen, chairman of the Progressive Labor Movement, which calls itself a Marxist-Leninist political organization for achieving socialism in the United States, said five of the witnesses were P.L.M. members.
