

Bibliography of Materials on the Struggle Against White Chauvinism in the Communist Movement:

1. Study Manual on Specific Manifestations of White Chauvinism in the Communist Movement: By DW from Southern California Local Center. This is the most extensive of bibliography of materials on white chauvinism. It is annotated with quotes from the readings. Special emphasis given to writings from the CPUSA 1928-1956. Available from SCALC.
2. Racism in the Communist Movement, NSC-OCIC. This is the basic line of the Campaign Against White Chauvinism. It also includes important articles from Harry Haywood's Book Black Bolshevik ch. 12, and 21.
3. The OC's Phoney War Against White Chauvinism and the Demise of the Fusion Line: Editorial Board of Line of March. This is the rectification's partybuilding lines basic summation of the collapse of the OCIC, and critique of the campaign. Available from Line of March Publications.
4. Documents from Conference on Racism and National Oppression, Planning Committee of conference. These are very useful documents which were used as the basis for discussion at the recent conference held in the Bay Area. They include the position which argues against the existence of the Black nation, either historically or today. In addition, it put forwards some beginning formulations about racial and national oppression in the US. The second main document takes up the question of Racism in the communist movement, as such it is both a critique of the OC's campaign, as well as an alternative framework. The basic perspective is the rectification partybuilding line, although all authors of the papers are not with Line of March.
5. Left Sectarianism in the Fight for Negro Rights and Against White Chauvinism, WZ Foster, Political Affairs, July 1953. This is one of the best articles for summing up the CPUSA's campaign in the 50's.
6. Organizer Articles by Clay Newlin on the Campaign. these were fun during the last year, they include a polemic with Ray Otake, and Bob Wing over the campaign.
7. Various documents from the OCIC struggle including the Open letter to the Partybuilding Movement, Against the Phoney War on White Chauvinism (Boston Local Center), etc.
