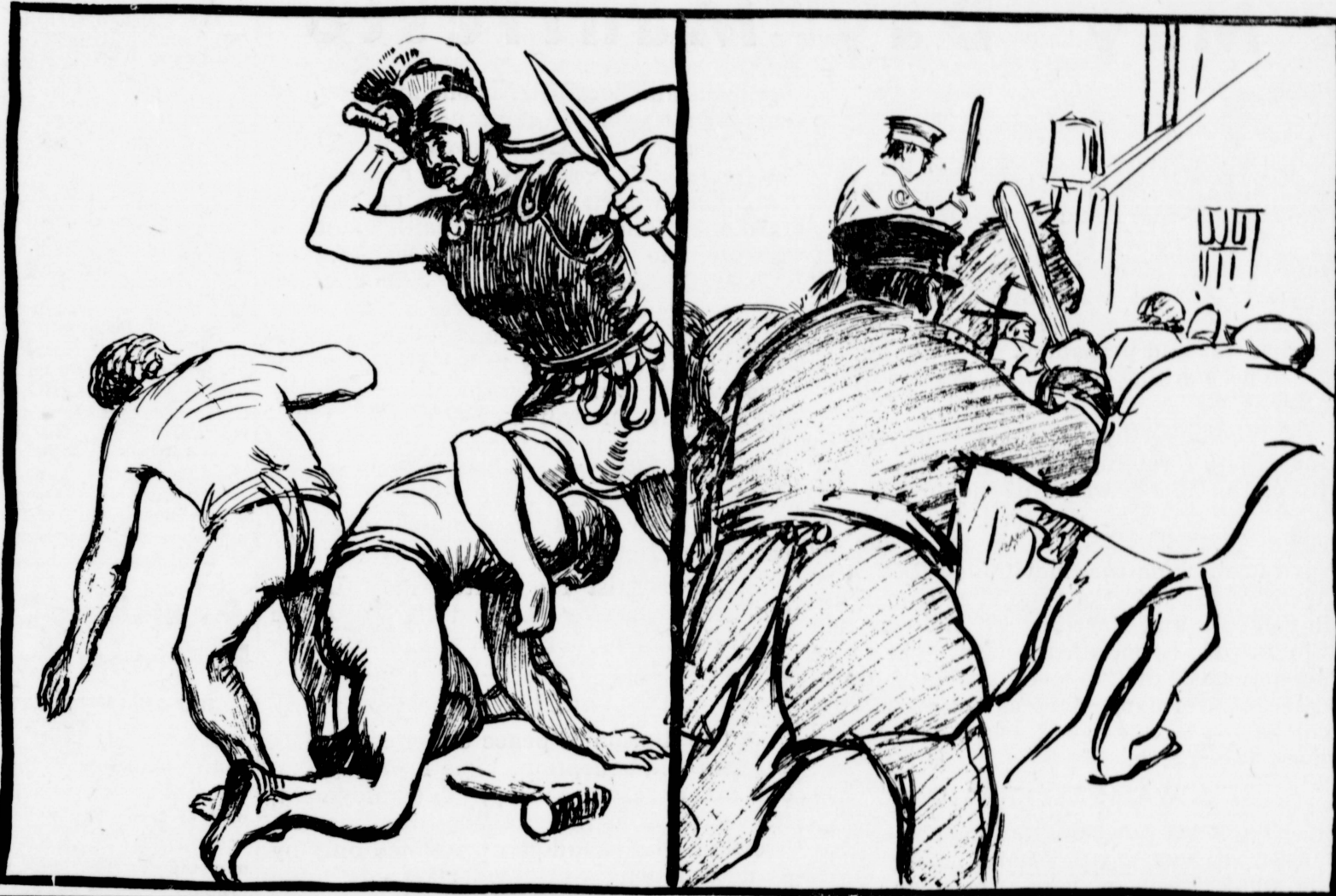

### Mexico Expropriates Oil Companies

The expropriations of the American and British oil holdings by the Mexican government gives the Mexican workers an opportunity of pushing forward an independent class policy. The policy of President Cardenas is to pay the oil companies in full, even though they refused to recognize the Mexican Government action. But since the pressure of U. S. imperialism through its refusal to buy any more silver has intensified the economic crisis in Mexico, the Government will do well to keep its head above water let alone talk of paying legal bourgeois debts.

Although the blow against the oil companies seemingly is aimed at American and British holdings with equal force, certain facts take the edge off its effectiveness against the U. S. More than once American interests in Latin America have used the tactic of "allowing" the local government to oust British and American interests, and then turning around and obtaining the whole concession for itself. This possibility underlying the Mexican pattern should be kept constantly in mind.

#### U. S. IN BETTER POSITION

England has developed her oil property and needs oil for war needs, while American interests have held in reserve their holdings and are not in need of this oil at present. The Mexican Callies group has a powerful group of American financiers behind it in its fight against Cardenas and the U. S. forces supporting him.

The Roosevelt viewpoint expressed by those close to the president is that the Mexican government should pay the oil companies only the original investment minus depreciation. On this basis the American and British oil companies are placed on different levels. Cardenas uses this as a bid to scale down values. Standard oil has invested very little in Mexican property in the last decade; the improvement on its original investment is therefore small. British companies, however, have

DETROIT — The attempt to cut the wages and destroy the Union of 6,000 Consumers Power Workers in Michigan has been defeated by the militant action of these utility workers. Faced with the prospect of having their gains taken away from them by the power magnates the power house workers of Consumers took control of the property of the company and declared they were on strike. They went one step ahead of the sit down tactic by continuing to operate the plants

## May Day Manifesto

Proletariat and oppressed masses of all lands make this May Day a step towards unifying your ranks against the impending imperialist war, and for the class war against capitalism. Under the Banner of the class struggle the organized might of the proletariat is invincible.

May Day 1938 finds capitalism from one end of the globe to the other floundering on the rocks. The so-called recession in the U. S. is the sharpest crisis in American history, more severe even than the 1929 crisis. To the millions already unemployed and half-starving, have been added millions more, doomed forever under the profit system to a slow starvation. Ominously overshadowing the whole is the mad drive of American Imperialism towards war.

#### BOSS METHODS

The cynical and hypocritical answer of capitalism to all this misery and oppression, consists of adding billions to the war budget plowing under more wheat and foodstuffs, cutting the relief and WPA budgets for the class as a whole. While the millions starve, their "Friend" in the White House draws up plans to "plow under" and produce less. While millions are looking for the things of life, for food and shelter, the "Smiling Pres-

ident" is preparing for more imperialist blood baths, for war and destruction.

In foreign lands the oppressed working class, the peasantry and colonial peoples are facing even worse. Disarmed and drugged by their reformist leaderships the working class of the world is unable to effectively fight the advancing tide of fascism that sweeps through the world. Hitler's butchers are mopping up in Austria. Thousands more are condemned to death and brutality in his concentration camps. The fascist Franco is sweeping before him all vestige of the democratic rights won by the proletariat through the class struggle, is mowing down thousands of workers who, trapped by the lies and hypocrisy of the Spanish Roosevelts, Lewis, Browders and Thomases, are heroically fighting against overwhelming odds.

From one end of Europe to the other the social barrel is filled with dynamite. Italian fascism, on the brink of bankruptcy, faces new mass struggles in the near future. British workers are being regimented for the desperate re-armament of British Imperialism. The French Proletariat, faces a revolutionary situation in the near future, as the Blums and Cachins betray at every step their servitude to French

## «Organized Capitalism» Gets Setback

The defeat of Roosevelt's reorganization bill, which provided for consolidation of many bureaus and increased power to the President, shows how deep is the ferment in the capitalist ranks.

Those who opposed the bill, like Father Coughlin, Hearst, Knox, the Republicans and Democratic anti-New Dealers, are not opposed to more bureaucracy in principle. Hearst is one of the supporters of Hitler centralization, and Coughlin is a semifascist in the U. S.

The oppositor was over WHO shall do the re-organizing, who shall dominate the patronage system. It is significant that there is no opposition to Secretary Hull's war policy, his denunciation of the pacifists who are preparing a "naval frontier", and his clear-cut policy of sending the navy out to all parts of the world to protect American capital.

### TOWARDS "ORGANIZED CAPITALISM"

The rumored 4 billion in pump priming planned by Roosevelt, direct loans to the states and municipalities without any interest, and loans through the Reconstruction Finance Corporation to industry, despite opposition will in one form or another probably pass.

The defeat of Roosevelt's reorganization plans are only temporary. The general trend of American capitalism is toward greater centralization and "organized" capitalism. The economic condition of the U. S. makes steps in that direction imminent.

## For Class Struggle May Day Demonstration

The battle cry of May Day on this Anniversary of the Haymarket martyrs, has been twisted into a pink tea fiesta by the Stalinists and Socialists.

The 1938 demonstration throughout the country are drum-beating processions for American imperialism in the next war. The battle cry of the reformists, "Collective Security," etc. is the battle cry of the Roosevelt capitalists AGAINST the working class.

### DON'T SUPPORT SOCIAL PATRIOTS

It is impossible for revolutionary workers to support the May Day demonstrations of the reformists this year. They are outright special patriotic. Previous ones, such as last year's, were class collaboration throughout. This is the first one, however, which comes out four square for the bosses' war plans. To support it would be to give a left cover to the attempts to line up the working class behind Wall Street's war drive.

Wherever possible the RWL will organize independent united front demonstrations with other forces on a minimum class struggle basis, or will hold outdoor meetings by itself, as well as indoor meetings in the evening.

# League Holds 4th Plenum

The 4th Plenum (meeting off from Detroit, Cleveland, New York, Washington, Central Committee and Control Commission members who could not attend sent messages of solidarity from Philadelphia, Columbus and Springfield.

Arrangements to speed up work on the draft program were pressed with the aim of completing the document before the next plenum meeting.

The plenum determined to launch an intensive three months anti-war campaign against the war plans of American imperialism.

### BROAD RESPONSE

Central Committee members and leading comrades came in

represent real progress. The hearty response of the plenum was a keynote for the coming period.

Further steps to advance the League were the consideration and decisions in regard to field work and colonizers, and to hold a two-week training course for functionaries in the early summer.

The plenum also terminated the struggle with the Stamm group whose revisionist positions on fundamental questions and refusal to abide by democratic centralism have led them outside the Marxist

The plenum took the first steps toward establishing a new collective leadership upon the basis of full political agreement with the RWL program and its 4th plenum decisions.

imperialism, raise prices, inflate, put over the capitalist rearmament plans — all in the name of Marx and Lenin.

In Asia, a weak Japan, plows steadily into China, slaughters its people, and replaces American and British imperialism as the foremost enslaver of the Chinese proletariat and peasantry.

The working class will answer these attacks.

Weakened by economic "recessions", faced with a rapidly receding market, fearful of the rising wrath of the proletariat, world imperialism snatches to the last straw, IMPERIALIST WAR, in order to save itself from the inevitable REVOLUTION of the working class. The skirmishes in Ethiopia and Austria, in Bolivia and China; the hypocritical diplomatic maneuvers of the "democratic" U. S. or the "fascist" Germany, have as their aim only one end — a new world war for the redivision of the earth.

### U. S. WAR PREPERATIONS

The most powerful nations are able to mask their war moves more subtly than the weak fascist powers. American imperialism, still possessing enormous power and resources, prepares for war under the cloak of "peace". But here in this country lies the biggest war monster of all, the most thirsty imperialist in the world. For American imperialism to exist must reorganize the world, must conquer it from its arch foe, the British empire.

### EXPLOITERS AGENTS

For the most part dormant, rising only on a few occasions, the working class of the world has been tied in the last year more firmly to the bourgeois wagon. Its towering strength has been kept muzzled by the 2nd and 3rd Internationals, with the aid of the centrists of all shades in all places.

In the United States our big task is to organize the organized into industrial unions with a class struggle policy.

The rising tide of strikes in the U. S., the strikes in Little Steel, on the docks in the west coast, and dozens of others ended either in complete defeat or only minor concessions. Brutal American "democracy" showed how "democratic" the capitalist dictatorship is. Eleven workers were massacred in the city of Chicago during the Steel Strike. More were murdered, arrested, framed, and beaten in other places and other sections.

But the main job of intimidating the working class of keeping them in check, fell to the capitalist agents WITHIN the ranks of labor. The Lewis' and Greens, the

stalinists and socialists, as one man jumped the bandwagon of capitalism when the strikes and "recession" threatend its very existence. The sit-down strike and "quickie" were entirely given up, strikes forbidden, and pledges of "faith" and aid given to the "democratic" Roosevelt.

Within the ranks of Labor these agents support the war moves of American imperialism. The stalinists, the biggest "working class" Party in the U. S. re-echo Roosevelt's war program, like Moscow parrots, hail his war moves in the Philippines and South America, pledge to support the "good" imperialism, America in its wars. The Labor Party, Socialist Party, AFL, CIO, WAA, stand fundamentally on the same program.

The centrist Trotskyites and Lovestoneites, careening around like drunken acrobats, in one degree or the other support these agents of American Capitalism.

### CLASS ACTION NEEDED

The illusion of peace under capitalism is fraud and deception. The Profit system can breed only misery, unemployment, starvation and imperialists war. Peace, Freedom and Bread can be gained only by a determined working class struggle against capitalism.

Under the domination of the stalinists the first Workers State, the Soviet Union, is threatend with destruction. The Stalin bureaucracy has betrayed the Dictatorship of the Proletariat to the imperialists, is liquidating the remnants of the October Revolution reintroducing private property, and fights against any extension of that revolution anywhere else.

Workers of the world rescue the Soviet Union from this band of traitors. Build a new Communist Party in the Soviet Union. Extend the October Revolution.

### UNITE AND FIGHT

Workers and Oppressed of America, white and black, colonial and native, raise your hand this May Day in giant protest against the whole rotten capitalist system. Let your shouts and slogans spread terror in the hearts of capitalism, remind it that the proletariat intends to seize power, to wrest a life of peace and contentment from the oppression of capitalism.

Now as never before erect your Marxist Party to help guide the whole people towards the Workers Society. The 2nd and 3rd Internationals and the centrists have and are betraying you. Your salvation lies only in the building of a New, 4th Communist International.

Join, Build, support the Revolutionary Workers League and its youth Section, the Young Workers League. Down with capitalism. Long Live the Workers State.

## TRADE UNION NOTES

### SUBSIDY ASKED BY R. R. UNION CZAR

The unanimity of George Harrison, Railroad Workers czar, and the rail owners in asking for subsidies from the government, not for the workers, if you please, but for the Companies, is touching indeed. Railroad workers face large pay cuts and lay offs and the answer of their "leader" is to get government money for their exploiters. Where labor fakery of the Harrison, Martin, Lewis, Frey types can bamboozle their member ships into servile submission they throw off their fancy pro-labor phrases and show their real faces, the humble tools of capitalism.

### STALINIST SUPPORT "KELLY-NASH"

The Chicago stalinist-controlled Workers Alliance is carrying through a "Moscow purge" in its ranks. Those who oppose the capitulatory scheme of the leadership to gain relief by humbly begging for a capitalist Special Legislature to take up the question, are being cut out of the organization without ceremony. Class struggle politics is forbidden in this unemployed organization, but the support of Kelly-Nash political machine is tolerated and in some cases considered a virtue.

In Local 24 of the Office Workers Union in Chicago the stalinists are giving the flimsy excuse for trying to get rid of a progressive organizer, that there's not enough money around. But in Local 26 of the Workers Alliance they put the Local in the red for a big meeting of stalinist speakers, few of whom even spoke on the problems of the unemployed.

## An archists Endorse Reformist Actions

### BLACK INTERNATIONAL

In spite of all the tailending and capitulation of the CNT in Spain, it is still receiving the support of the "Black" or "First" International (anarchist) movement. This support was expressed at their special Paris conference last December which endorsed the entry of the CNT into the government, its support of the People's Front, the liquidation of the "Anti-Fascist Militias", the betrayal in the May Days, etc. The conference even "resolved to exert pressure on the "democratic" governments to end the farce of non-intervention!" Even the past two months of terrible defeats seem to have taught the anarchists nothing.

In action anarchism becomes reformism. It can not serve the workers' interest.

without the control of the capitalists. The workers themselves took steps toward the workers control of production.

The seizure of the plants aroused the fury of the capitalist class. Vigilantes were organized. Governor Murphy, New Deal supporter denounced the "strike" as a threat to private property. He called a conference of Union representatives and employers, but was unable to smash the strike. The new method of conducting a strike resulted in a renewal of the 4 month agreement and the warding off of wage cuts.

### STRIKE — BREAKERS AT WORK

In the next sixty days the workers will be confronted with a National Labor Relations Board election in which a company union, and the AFL outfit, will have free competition in their attempt to destroy the Union.

The workers are organized in the Utility Workers Organizing Committee, a CIO affiliate. During the strike the AFL sided with Murphy and the employers. F. M. Harris of the AFL Union threatened to shut down 9 power plants in Western Michigan if an agreement was reached with the UWOC.

### WORKERS CONTROL

This strike — and the new tactic developed — clearly illustrates the aim of the working class. In this period of the decay of the capitalist system it becomes increasingly clear that first in the demands of the working class must be the workers own control of production. The Capitalist Government—Roosevelt, Murphy, etc., must be swept away and replaced by a workers government that will organize production for use and not for profit.

In the immediate future the Consumers workers must coordinate their efforts with the organized workers in the towns to which they supply power, and the unemployed and farmers in the surrounding territory. Against the armed vigilantes and Black Legionaires they must create a Workers Defense Corps. The breathing spell will only prepare a better opportunity for Murphy to use the National Guard. They must attempt to establish friendly connections with the AFL workers in other power plants in spite of their strike breaking leaders.

# Smash Exploiters' War Plans

## DOWN WITH THE CAPITALIST WAR PLANS

The war in Spain and China and the Hitler push in the Balkans reveals the feverish preparations of the imperialists for the coming war and redivision of the earth. In this mad race of armaments the United States leads while it talks of peace. The United States is heading rapidly toward war.

The workers must not permit the war preparations and the imperialist war to go unchallenged. The workers must fight against the imperialist wars by the CLASS STRUGGLE.

### CAPITALISM AND WAR

As long as capitalism exists imperialists wars are inevitable. They are as inevitable as depressions, misery and poverty under capitalism. When the American capitalists declare war the working class must struggle to turn the imperialist war into a civil war by working for the defeat of its "own" imperialist army, by revolutionary class action, even if this momentarily means the "victory" of the "enemy" army.

### CLASS ACTION.

The workers through their organizations, must form united fronts for joint action against war preparations on concrete issues. This does not mean the establishment of a permanent "united front" to "fight against War". Such an instrument would become a negation of the united front and would be an instrument for reformists. Only the revolutionary Marxian party can lead the struggle against imperialist war. It utilizes the Leninist United Front in this struggle.

### THE PEOPLES FRONT, FASCISM, AND WAR.

The Stalinist Peoples Front policy has proven bankrupt in stopping the onmarch of Fascism and war. In fact it has helped pave the way for Fascist gains in Spain and the Balkans. That is because the Peoples Front is an instrument by which the reformists subordinate the proletariat to the "democratic" bourgeois in its fight against the open reactionary bourgeoisie. Fascism can be destroyed only by overthrowing capitalism. Because Fascism is only an acute stage of capitalism when economic decay and the danger of the proletariat revolution forces the exploiters to save their system by these methods.

### THE SOVIET UNION

We consider the Soviet Union as a warped Workers State, a dictatorship of the proletariat, evolving back toward capitalism by the false Stalinist policies. Our task is to oust the agents of the capitalists, the Stalinist reformists, and again restore healthy economic and social relations that will lead toward socialism and to extend the October Revolution.

The best way to accomplish this is first of all work for the overthrow of our own

to defend the Soviet Union against its imperialist enemies and its agents within the Soviet Union. This calls for the conditional defense of the Soviet Union in war. In the imperialist country the workers fight to defeat their own exploiters. In the Soviet Union they fight to defend the warped workers republic against the imperialists and their agents within. This calls for a fight on two fronts, similar to the struggle in a strike when, in order to win the workers must fight against the bosses and their

labor agents in our union ranks, the reformists policies, and sell-outs. Stalinism cannot successfully defend the Soviet Union. Only a new Marxian party and the proletariat can successfully defend and save the Soviet Union.

### REFORMIST SOLUTIONS

The workers must not become victims of reformist traps. Pacifism, which in words is against ALL wars (especially the class war) but in reality helps prepare the ground for the imperialist war must be rejected. Likewise all talk for: "collective security", "neutrality", "Disarmament" "isolation", etc., are the best smokecreens to cover up war preparations.

The workers want "peace". But the workers are not for "peace" under capitalism—for class peace. The workers are for class struggle. When war breaks out we fight to stop it. We fight for peace, by working for the overthrow of capitalism. But peace can only be achieved in a classless communist society.

### FASCISM AND DEMOCRACY

The reformists talk about supporting the democratic exploiters against the fascist exploiters is another way of preparing for imperialist war and is social-patriotism. We are opposed to the support of any and all capitalists nations no matter what they claim the war is for. It must be kept in mind that every STATE is a dictatorship (against the oppressed classes) and serves out democracy to its own class. Today we have the capitalist dictatorship against the workers. We must replace this with our dictatorship against the exploiters. A Workers State that will insure genuine workers democracy in the broadest sense.

### AGAINST PACIFIST BILLS

The illusion that war can be prevented, checked, or exposed through a referendum is pacifist and anti-working class. The exploiters and war mongers cannot be effectively exposed by asking for a referendum on war. Imperialist wars can only be exposed and fought against on the basis of a class line. To transfer the war struggle to the parliamentary sphere as does the Ludlow amendment is false and in no way serves the working class ends.

To attempt to establish a permanent boycott against the "bad" capitalists is of no value to check the aggressors. In the case of Japan it plays into the hands of the American imperialists. The main struggle against capitalism and war is not on the field of commodity consumption — but on the field of production. To use boycott as an auxiliary weapon, as a limited concrete action within the framework of a class policy is alright, but this has nothing in common with the reformists permanent "boycott".

### REFORMIST AND CENTRISTS

The Stalinists as well as the right wing socialists present an open social-patriot position on imperialist war, against the position of Lenin. The "left" wing socialists present a centrist position in some cases on war, using radical phrases and conservative, reformist actions.

Likewise the Trotskyite socialists have a centrist position on war. For example, Trotsky speaks of a war between Germany and France stating he would apply defeatism in Germany and political criticism in France. In Spain the Trotskyites support the Peoples Front State by demanding material aid to the Peoples Front. In China they trail along with the Koumingtang with "left" criticism.

Against the capitalists and their agents the workers must present a clear class struggle position

completed their holdings with all modern improvements.

Britain is in no position to take action alone against Mexico. If America does not move on parallel lines Britain will lose heavily. With the new silver restrictions America will get what she wants and most likely drive British interests from the field.

Unlike the Trotskyites and others, we do not support the Mexican government in its expropriation. Cardenas is a puppet of a group of American imperialists against the Calles group of American imperialists and the British imperialists. He gains his support from the rising national bourgeoisie and the workers and peasant bloc he controls through his "reforms".

### TRY TO STOP REVOLUTION

America's former purchase of silver at a rate higher than the market value was a flat present of millions a year in support of Cardenas' policy. It was dedicated not out of love for Mexico but of fear of a SOCIAL REVOLUTION and the danger of either Communism or an unfriendly military dictatorship if the present set-up falls.

To welcome expropriation of "our" imperialists in any country and to support the capitalist state of that country are two different things. We support the workers and peasants of Mexico and Latin America, in their INDEPENDENT CLASS ACTION. Parallel action and united front action with the forces "fighting" against imperialism can only be effected on the basis of a line for independent working class action and no support to the State. To support Cardenas and his government is to support capitalism. To fight imperialism means to fight its puppets like Cardenas, as well.

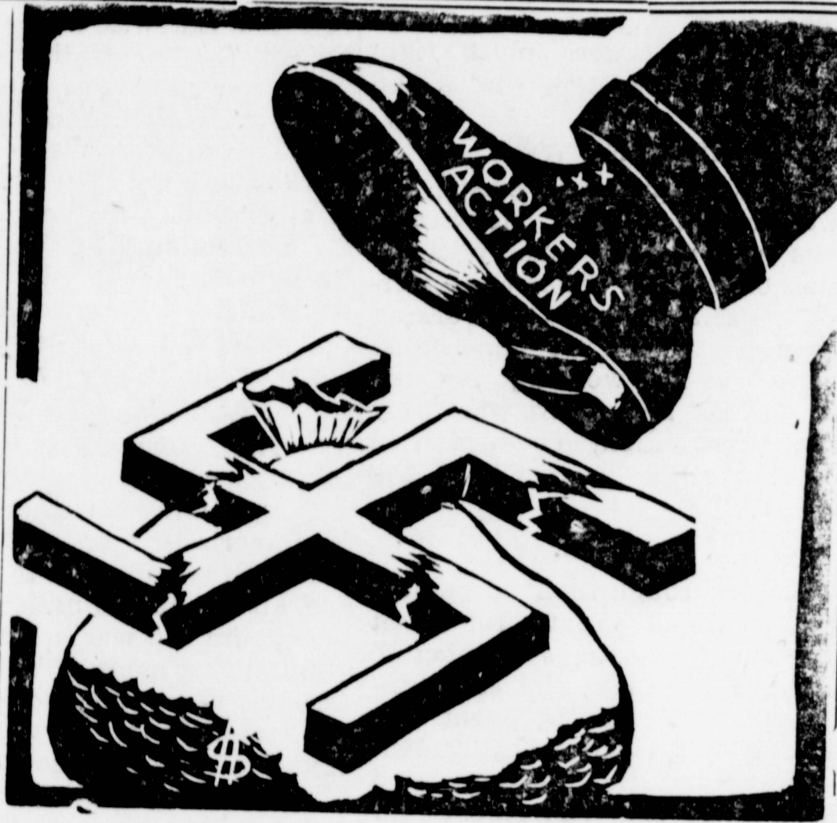
