THE WORLD FRONT AGAINST U.S. AGGRESSION IN VIETNAM by Pat Jordan

The following is a list - but is by no means complete - of actions reported by the press, country by country, against the U.S. bombing of North Vietnam. It shows that the people in Britain opposing the Labour Government's <u>de facto</u> support of the U.S. action are not alone. In fact they are on the same side of the fence as the overwhelming majority of the ordinary people of the world. Labour ought to be on this list.

Aden: protests by the People's Socialist Party and Aden TUC.

Albania: Government denounce . mass demonstrations.

Algeria: Government denounce, all papers, all mass organisations, mass protests demonstrations in large tours.

Argentina: demonstrations ending in burning of U.S. flag outside embassy, all trade unions and left wing parties protesting U.S. action.

Australia: demonstrations in Melbourne and Sydney, 20 Victoria trade unions signed protest and sent delegates to U.S. consul.

Belgium: Committe of solidarity with Vietnam set up, demonstration in Brussels, protest by Socialist Workers! Party.

Basutoland: protest by Basutoland Congress Party (main party).

Bechuanaland: protest by Bechuanaland People's Party.

Bolivia: demonstrations, protests by left parties and trade unions.

Bulgaria: Government protest, demonstrations by Bulgarians and foreign students.

Burma: Government papers denounced action, mass organisations protested.

Cambodia: Government protest, demonstrations, protests by mass organisations.

Cameroons: Union of the Peoples of the Cameroons Party protested.

Canada: demonstration several hundred strong in Montreal outside U.S. Consulate. Ceylon: Government papers denounce, mass organisations protested, demonstrations.

Chile: Main trade union federation denounced action, demonstrations in Valparaiso and Santiago. Miners' union denounced.

China: Over 11 million people take part in demonstrations. Colombia: demonstrations in Bogota against U.S. Embassy.

Congo (Brazzaville): Government protest, Trade Union Federation denounced U.S.

Costa Rica: Demonstration against U.S. Embassy, Newspapers and the radio station,
Costa Rica al Dia, denounced U.S. bombings.

Cuba: Government denounced action, all mass organisations have organised demonstrations in main towns.

Cyprus: Trade unions denounced U.S. over bombings.

Czechoslovakia: Government protest, demonstrations by Czechs and foreign students.

Denmark: daily demonstrations outside U.S. Embassy, PSP and unions protest.

France: demonstrations including one 10,000-strong on 12th, most capitalist papers, including Le Monde, Le Combat, Paris-Jour, etc, very critical of U.S. Finland demonstrations against U.S. Embassy, left wing parties and trade unions protest.

Egypt: Government denounced action, all mass organisations protest.

Ghana: Government denounced action, mass organisations protest.

Guinea: Government protests U.S. action, mass organisations call demonstrations.

Honduras: slogans painted on U.S. Embassy denouncing bombings.

Hungary: Government denounced action, demonstrations by Hungarians and foreign students.

Iceland: protests by trade unions and left wing organisations.

India: U.S. action criticised by capitalist papers, left wing parties and trade unions protest, demonstrations in Calcutta and Bombay.

Indonesia: Government denounces U.S., huge demonstrations all over country on many occasions, every mass organisation protests against U.S. bombings.

Iraq: Government papers denounce U.S.

Italy: Demonstrations in Rome, Milan, Reggio Emilia, Trieste, Venice, Forbi, Turin, Genoa, Verona, Matera, Florence, Pistoria, Pisa, Correggio, Reggio Calabra, and many other places. Demonstrators in Rome took advantage of snow (the first for some years) to snowball all U.S. Embassy windows. Huge volume of protests from workers organisations.

Japan: Committee of solidarity with Vietnam set up supported by Socialist Party, Communist Party and 44 other groups, even Liberal Democrat MPs in support, demonstrations include 28,000-strong one in Tokyo (15th), 12,000-strong in

Osaka, 5,000 in Tokyo (10th) 2,000-strong in Fukuoka.

Laos: Neo Lao Haksat Party denounced U.S. action.

Lebanon: Kamal Jumblatt, M.P., and other leading figures denounced action.

Kenya: Government papers and leading members of KANU protested.

Malaya: Malayan Labour Party denounced U.S. bombings.

Mali: Government denounced U.S. massorganisations protested.

Mexico: Demonstration against U.S. Embassy, capitalist papers critical of U.S.

Morocco: Government papers denounced U.S. action.

Mozambique: Mozambique National Democratic Union, Mozambique Liberation Front protested.

Nepal: Government newspapers denounced bombings.

New Zealand: demonstrations in Auckland and Wellington (supported by trade unions). Nicaragua: Slogans painted on U.S. Embassy.

Norway: PSP denounced action, demonstration against U.S. Embassy, capitalist newspapers critical of U.S.

Okinawa: Okinawa People's Party denounced U.S. action.

Pakistan: Government newspapers, main political party and mass organisations denounced U.S., demonstration against U.S. Embassy.

Panama: demonstration against U.S. embassy.

Philippines: mass demonstration against American action.

Poland: Government protested, demonstrations by Poles and foreign students.

Somalia: Government denounced U.S. action, mass organisations protested.

South Africa: Pan African Congress, African National Congress denounced U.S. action. South West Africa: S.W. African National Unior and S.W. African People's Organisation

denounced U.S. bombings.

Roumania: Government protested, Roumanians and foreign students denounced bombings. Saaziland: Swaziland Ngwane National Liberation Congress and Swaziland Progressive Party denounced U.S. bombings.

Sweden: capitalist news papers, e.g., Stockholms-Tidningen, denounced U.S. action. Switzerland: National Zeitung & Le Journal de Geneve criticised U.S. action.

Uruguay: Huge demonstration in Montevideo on 9th attacked U.S. Embassy.

U.S.A.: 2,000 Berkeley students demonstrated on 8th, demonstrations in New York, San Francisco, Yale University, outside UNO building, outside White House, and in many universities (organised by YSA) Venezuela: demonstrations in Caracas and other towns, FLN denounced US action.

Yemen: Government denounced US action.

Zimbabwe: Zimbabwe African National Union & Zimbabwe African People's Union protested.
