PROOF OF EVOLUTION WRITTEN TO SCOPE TRIAL RECORDS BY SCIENTISTS; CASE NEARING END

DAYTON, Tenn., July 20.—In one of the most amazing legal documents of history, eight professors had the heart of science here today in a tremendous effort to prove evolution, after they were tried to reconcile it with divine creation. A series of affidavits written into the record of the Scope trial.

The most of science, in the hands of John Thomas Scopes, produced one of the most comprehensive cases for evolution ever conceived. It carried a mass attack upon the fundamentalism of religion and their literal interpretation of the bible. The apostles of religion described the bible as a human, historical document, passed down through the ages, and not as a book of tradition as a text book for religion.

Placed in Records The scientific data totaling about 25,000 words and based on the statements of hundreds of experts, was placed in the trial record by affidavits in open court. As a result, the defense will see the record of their violation in accepting the anti-proven conviction of Scope to higher courts.

Every branch of science entered the case for Scope. There were Dr. William C. Curtis,ologist of the University of Chicago; Dr. Maynard M. Merrill, research biologist of Johns Hopkins University; William A. Nelson, state geologist of Tennessee; Dr. Fay Cooper Cole, anthropologist, University of Chicago; and Dr. J. H. Huxley, educational director, University of Chicago; Dr. Jacob G. Linnam, dean of agriculture, University of Tennessee; and Dr. Kirkley F. Mather, University of Tennessee.

"First Law of Science" The scientists defended against the "first law of life" to eliminate it from the curriculum of schools, colleges and universities would bring the case to a close. It was a direct result of the Scopes trial. (Continued on page 2)

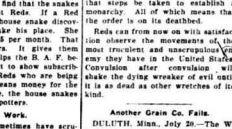

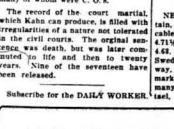

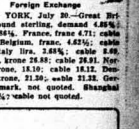
