The loss of agricultural machines can only be roughly estimated at about 50 per cent. Moreover, as the life of such machinery normally only 15 years, much of this is now being replaced. The improvement in agriculture has created a great demand for agricultural machinery and implements.

The importance of Russian grain to the population of Great Britain lies not only in the immense increase of supply possible through our help, but also in the fact that grain, controlled by a Socialist State, cannot be included in the operations of producing profits.

Methods of Agriculture

An investigation by an advisory delegate of conditions in the villages of the Ukraine wheat-growing area shows that nothing was now wanting but capital to produce an immense increase in production. The political importance of the scissors problem was that as the "scissors" opened they forced apart the "clamp." The peasant could produce for his necessities, but he was unable to sell his produce. The State, therefore, exercised its power to reduce prices of manufactured goods and to increase prices of agricultural produce.
