The main source of sport is agriculture, about 80 per cent. of the total, which has now reached 75 per cent. of lapre-wate, with a total of 23,00,000 gold roubles. The program for this year contemplate a total of 500,000,000, or over double that of last year. The program includes butter, eggs, fowis, and game, all products which Great Britain used to export largely.

The fur trade is again developing its resources, having beer enormously increased by a ten years suspension, and this year it will reach 30,00,000 gold roubles. Timber accounts for about a fifth of the whole, and its rejources are comparatively inex haustible. Of the other main branches of trade, the oil expension is at present hampered by the operations of the principal oil combines, but is developing rapidly, as also is fax export.

It is interesting to note that about 20,000,000 poods of grain re exported to Germany and to France, and only one million Great Britain. On the other hand, Great Britain took more in half the timber exported.

The authorities controlling foreign commerce are accordingly directing their attention to administrative economies, and expedients for lessealing overhead expenses and quickening the turnover of capital.
