the Revolution so far as new conditions allowed. These results, such as eight-hour day, minimum wage, employers' liabiltity, insurance, etc., are much the same as obtain eisewhere.

It is based on the principle that the land ownership is vested in the State, and its main func-tion. The Criminal Code of November, 1922, has little of special interest. Capital punkshment is confined to convictions for con-spiracy of a serious character.
