





In neither campaign does labor offer a united front to its oppressors, with the result that the political agents of the great capitatists can afford the great Luxury of flighting among themists can store the great Luxury of flighting among themists

The bankruptcy of the "socialists," who went into the LaFollette third party last year, meekly and quiescent, is evident in both the eastern municipal election and in the western state poll to select, a successor for the lats Wisconsin
