From Scarborough to Liverpool

When the labor party conference opens today in Liverpool the whole world will be watching, looking for the answer to the question, "Will Liverpool follow Scarborough?"

It was a terrible shock to the frayed nerves of the bourgeoisie and their agents, when the Trades Union Congress at Scarborough adopted a Bolshevik resolution against the empire, declaring for self-determination even to the point of separation of all colonial peoples. It gave an omen to Michael Tomney, representative of the Russian Union, when it approved of the Anglo-Russian Unity Commission, and when it approved of the project of world unity. A host of terror went up all over the world, from capitalists, from preachers, and from "labor leaders." Ramsay MacDonald cut short his visit with the king in order to try to stem the tide, but without avail. All the big labor "labor cabinet" except Whitley, who has been doing his bit to stop the leftward drive, but they have fallen as MacDonald failed. And now they are all gathered at Liverpool at the labor party conference.

It is unfortunate that the left wing in the labor party is still so weak ideologically. They are not strong enough to stand sufficiently definite and uncompromising when faced with the necessity to break cleanly with MacDonald. They are profoundly tainted with christianity and a millitary struggle against the bourgeoisie. The labor party is in a state of struggle. But even the Labor Weekly in its current issue declares in large bold type:

"The immediate task before us is to bring the labor party membership as a whole into conscious action of left wing policy as the trade unions have before us."

These left "wingers" are most of them Communists. But they have lost their faith of Communism, and recognize in the Communist the essential element of their struggle against the bourgeoisie. They are, for example, "It is true that the labor party at present foolishly excludes the Communist; but that is a small matter, easily and soon, we believe, to be put right."

It is amusing to see "our own" New York Times rush to the rescue of MacDonald. It quotes approvingly his words against the Communists, peddling out, when MacDonald is not quite drastic enough and deploring the weakness of some of his words. And the capitalist lobbies inside the labor movement are "no less" the trade union "labor cabinet" except Whitley, who has been doing his bit to stop the leftward drive, but they have fallen as MacDonald failed. And now they are all gathered at Liverpool at the labor party conference.

But just as the revolutionary program of struggle against and overthrow of capitalism will march triumphantly from one end of Britain and the empire to the other, so also will it become ever more powerful in the United States, until it carries the American Federation of Labor as the British reds carried Scarborough. And it looks very much as if at Liverpool, this week, another advance will be made.


