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GERMANY SIGNS ECONOMIC TREATY WITH SOVIET RUSSIA; HAILED AS BREAKING LONG BLOCKADE

MOSCOW, U. S. S. R., Oct. 12.—The Russ-German economic treaty was signed with impressive ceremonies at the foreign office here late today. The treaty contains benefits for both Germany and Russia and is much broader in scope than a mere commercial and trade treaty.

It is hailed here as breaking the economic blockade against Russia. It recognizes the stipulations of the treaty of Rapallo, signed in 1922.

MUSSOLINI INSTRUCTS ITALIAN DEBT MISSION TO DEMAND EXIST TERMS

ROME, Oct. 12.—Premier Mussolini sent the members of the Italian debt mission to the United States Government with the instruction that they should demand the same terms as were offered by the Italian Government.

Mussolini still stands upon his insistence that Italy should be settled upon the basis of her territory to pay, and that the debt should be repaid in the form of receipt of German reparations.

## The Alignment at Locarno

"Pols and Czech New Herald For Security Pact," says the Chicago Tribune's headline over the dispatch from Locarno on October 13.

It can be said with certainty that this headline is a height that not even the aging leopards of France, England and Germany will be able to surmount if without injury to the robber interests they represent.

All observers at Locarno appear to agree on one point: That Germany will have conceded to a guarantee of the existing Polish and Czecho-Slovakian frontiers and on another point there is also substantial agreement, i. e., that if Foreign Minister Stresemann should make such an agreement, world peace will last until his return to Berlin.

Dispatches state that the diplomats are seeking a "formula" that will overcome the nationalistic dogmatism of the old world formula can eradicate the underlying national antagonisms which freeze the question to the fore.

## Hearst's Political Backstep

The failure of the New York agents of William Randolph Hearst to find a candidate to run in the majority campaign under the present franchise has no political significance. Hyman, the present majority defeated by Tammany in the primary election, was not even named by Hearst, but thru a combination of political circumstances had the endorsement of the Tammany in his previous campaign.

When it was decided that Hearst would not run, Hearst endeavored to find a suitable candidate that could defeat the politician he represents.

Hearst, thru his chain of most powerful papers in the east, is the political leader of the petty-bourgeoisie—the small industrialists, shopkeepers, real estate sharks and strata of professionals not bonded to the economic tie to bank capital. The first candidate in this political adventure was Florio H. LaGuardia, former republican congressman who was re-elected on the LaFollette ticket last year. LaGuardia stands high in the councils of the city and party, and is a man of the west and had just returned to New York after playing an important part in the campaign that sent young Bob LaFollette to the United States senate.

For a number of years Hearst has been endeavoring to bring under his domination someone with sufficient prestige among both the petty-bourgeoisie and the capitalist class of the east and small businessmen of the west to force the link that will unite these two elements prepared to a drive to create a third party in which Hearst could be the boss.

LaGuardia refused to permit himself to be experimented with in this manner as he probably knows full well that the Middle West petty-bourgeoisie he could not control. The first candidate in this political adventure was Florio H. LaGuardia, former republican congressman who was re-elected on the LaFollette ticket last year.
