It is charged that the bureau is under control of those who late the cotton prices to suit their own pocketh that these cotton profiteers have stolen "a quarter of a mil-lion dollars," in the words of Senator Caraway, of Arkansas, from the cotton growers by simply having their experts pre-dict an unprecedented cotton crop, resulting in a big drop in prices. The gamblers in cotton then step in and buy up the crop at low prices, holding in until the price again returns to
