## Can't Stop the Fall of FEDERATION the Franc in France Thru **Pawning French Industry**

TODAY, the "franc statesmen" in Paris are considering nother plan for saving French currency. The proposition looks like a mortgage on French industry. The French capitalists, who seem to favor this latest panaces, are evidently willing to impose this "Downse plan" upon thomselves, in order to save their preclous profits, before Morgan and tother international bankers in Wall Streat, do if for them.

The suggestion first came from the toxile barons of northern France. It is proposed to pawn the assets of French industry for a loan of \$400,000,000 to satisfy the rapacious needs of the nation's internal debt, that barks treasury. It is declared the metal and pottery interests join in support of the plan.

When the French capitalists talk of pawning the assets of French industry, they mean that they are merely pawning their ability and power to exploit the French working class. Without the workers securely harnessed to the capitalist industrial machine, the so-called "mortgage" wouldn't be worth the paper it is written on.
