Such extertion of "confessions has nothing in common with scientific procedure. As long ago as the close of the eighteenth century the classic school of criminology arose to combat torture ected persons. That school has been superseded by the posior suspected persons. That senon has been superseded by the posi-tivists and the so-called economists. A hundred and fifty years' scientific advancement separates the science of criminology from police and legal practice today.
