It is not enough to stop at the knowledge of the general trend of capitalist economy, to understand merely that capitalism, like other systems preceding it, is doomed to perish. It is not enough to gener alize, in fact it is dangerous to proceed into a conflict with the forces of capitalism in any field, without the general plan of campaign being sed upon a minute examination of the relation of forces at the time of conflict and a concrete analysis of capitalist economy.
