

Celebrating the Paris Commune Anniversary

SIXTY-TWO years ago today the working class of Paris "stormed the heavens." In the two months and ten days, beginning March 18, 1871, the working class held Paris, and in the holocaust of the final days when 30,000 died at the hands of the counter-revolution...

No year since the Commune has passed without its celebration. In these decades the number of toilers and oppressed of the world who pay homage to their matchless martyrdom and learned lessons from their heroism have grown from a few thousands to millions.

As long as Marx and his great companion-in-arms, Frederick Engels, lived, the struggle to stress this fundamental lesson of the Commune, and it is not accidental that the second international, the social-democratic leaders, who try to deprive the working class of the revolutionary weapon of Marxism should take as their starting point the falsification of the lessons of the Commune.

The proletariat in the realms of the former czars of Russia, the consolidation of Soviet power, the use of the proletarian state power to destroy capitalism; the building of socialism through the first Five-Year Plan, the launching of the second Five-Year-Plan...

In Germany today, in Poland, in China—in every part of the world—the lessons of the Commune are being applied. Its traditions are being carried on by the Communist International and its sections, the Communist Parties of the world, the Parties that are leading the toiling masses toward the revolutionary way out of the thralldom of a decaying capitalism.
