



Steel Chiefs Accept Aid From Lodges Fraternal Groups' Move to Spur Campaign Praised by Golden

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Aug. 11.—Leaders of the Steel Workers Organizing Committee, in charge of the far-flung drive to organize steel, expressed gratification at the results of the preliminary national conference of fraternal organizations held at the William Penn Hotel here.

"We feel that every progressive, forward-looking citizen, or organization, will consider the attempt to organize the thousands of men of all nationalities and religions employed in the steel industry, as the best contribution to the well-being of the thousands of families whose lives depend on the wages received by their husbands and brothers working in this great industry, and who are at present very much underpaid because of the lack of a union in this field."

Plans were made by the representatives of a group of some of the nation's biggest language groups to swing more than a quarter million members behind the drive to organize the industry.

"It goes without saying, since the respective fraternal orders are mainly composed of wage earners, with the biggest percentage in this district composed of miners and steel workers, that the question of an organizing drive in the steel industry directly affects the very existence of such organizations."

Charges Dropped Against 3 Cubans Now in Exile

HAVANA, Aug. 11.—Charges against former President Ramon Grau San Martin, Joaquin Martinez Saenz, leader of the republican ABO and Joaquin Ordoqui, labor leader, of "plotting insurrection" were yesterday quashed by a Cuban Emergency Court under the provisions of the new amnesty law. All three men have been in exile since the Menditea regime.

3 U. S. Peace Groups To Attend Congress

50 American Delegates Prepare to Leave for Brussels Sessions on Sept. 3—Dr. Harry F. Ward Is Leader of Delegation

Delegates from the United States to the World Peace Congress, to be held in Brussels from Sept. 3 to 6, are completing final preparations before their departure.

The American delegates, about 50 in all, will be made up of three groups, organized by the National Peace Congress, Labor unions, and the American League Against War and Fascism.
