The Masses Move to the Left

In nearly all these small countries, the masses, in sharp reaction to war and the entire system which inevitably operated to produce more wars, developed strong leftward tendencies. Great peasant movements began to surge toward the ends of power. Peasants forced vast agrarian reforms, or seemed about to force them. At the same time, in urban centers, as well as in the country, the Communist sentiment increased by leaps and bounds. In the Slavic, and even in the non-Slavic countries, the direction of the masses was instinctively toward Soviet Russia and collectivism. At one time or another between 1919 and 1922 most of the Italian and East-European countries were on the verge of going Red.

THE HITLER TERROR

by the Central Powers. A month later, however, the German and Italian armies were invading Russia to force on the Soviet Government the humiliating armistice Treaty of Brest-Litovsk. In the spring and summer of 1918 the lines and the United States began their long and destructive intervention which, providing at the material and psychological aid that White counter-revolutionaries needed, ultimately cost the Soviet Union millions in lives of billions in property. Then in the spring of 1919 the Poles started a war of their own against Russia and held for a brief period a section of the Ukraine. Such were the wars given to the masses and repeated are proposals of the Soviet Government.

No Annexation, No Intrigues
Not only did the Soviet Government strive to bring peace from the earliest days, but it openly and publicly renounced all of the imperialist aims and intrigues of the Tsarist regime. On December 7, 1917, a proclamation was issued under the signatures of Lenin and Stalin reading in part: "Constantinople still remains in the hands of the Mohammedans. We announce that the agreement on the rithion of Persia is torn up and annulled. We announce that the agreement on partition Turkey and the seizure of Armenia is torn up and annulled." The Communists also published the secret imperialist treaties between the Tsarist Government and the Allies, much to the chagrin and anger of the latter. Later, U.S.S.R. renounced the territorial contracts between in China, the extra-territorial priv-

ileges of the Central Powers. Lenin and his colleagues at the very start. It has done this in the face of continual and bitter provocations abroad, such as the assassination of ambassadors and diplomatic agents, raids on embassies and consulates, the publication and use for hostile purposes of forged documents, and open threats and insults from hostile governments like those in power today in Japan and Germany. The U.S.S.R. has again and again embarrassed the various imperialistic and imperialist nations at Geneva by suggesting measures that would lead to real disarmament.

At the 1925 conference it offered a proposal for complete disarmament and in 1923 supported the American plan for a one-third cut in military budgets. The Soviet Government signed the Kellogg Peace Pact at the earliest opportunity and was the first government to

do so. It has in addition initiated and concluded non-aggression pacts with fifteen states, the first one being with Turkey in 1925. During the course of the annually successful World Economic Conference in London in the summer of 1923, Soviet representatives signed such pacts with eleven nations, setting a new example in clearness and strictness of definition on what constitutes aggression. The U.S.S.R. now has non-aggression agreements with all bordering countries, except Japan, which has refused to enter into such a compact. In 1921, when accusations of Soviet dumping were at their height, Moscow again called the bluff of the capitalist powers by proposing at Geneva an international economic non-aggression pact including restrictions against dumping, tariffs, and other forms of

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
