EVERETT CASES STIRRING THE ENTIRE NATION PROSECUTION MUDDLED

Seattle, Wash., March 14.—In a crowded courtroom the battle for the life of Thomas H. Tracy, the workman charged with the murder of Jefferson Board at Everett, Wash., on November 5th, is now proceeding. One thing that the men in jail have found very irksome has been the lack of visitors. For two months or more after their arrest no visitors at all were allowed to see the men. Lately this rule has been somewhat modified, but the visiting days now are Tuesdays and Fridays from 10 a. m. to 3 p. m. and each visitor can see but one of the prisoners, and for only fifteen minutes at that...
