THE ENGLISH RAILWAY WORKERS' UNION

The Amalgamated Society of Railway Servants of England has published the first complete report issued upon the conditions prevalent among its members.

The fact is shown that over 100,000 men are working at a wage of one pound, or \$4.86, a week or under. More than one-half the total number employed receive less than \$7.29 and only about 11 per cent earn more than \$7.50.

The classes known as station masters, inspectors, clerks, laborers and mechanics in shops are not included, they not being under the care of the Amalgamated Society.
