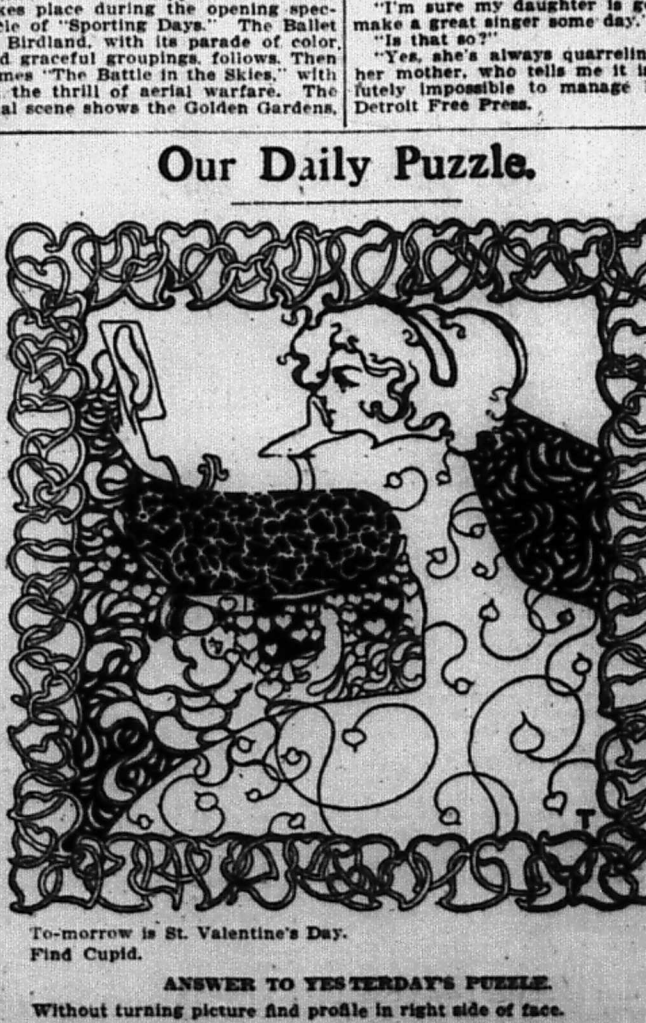
AT BROOKLYN THEATERS
