No Attempt at Sensationalism in Double Performance of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony, by Walter Damrosch, Conductor Declares.

Why should Walter Damrosch perform the Ninth Symphony twice at the same concert? Why should a conductor radically opposed to encores go through as long and serious a work as that symphony twice in the same evening?

"It is absolutely ridiculous," he said, "to mention the word 'sensationalism' in connection with the last concert of our Beethoven Cycle. I hold that the Ninth Symphony is an enigma of colossal magnitude and unequalled beauty, but still an enigma. It is in the history of music what 'Hamlet' is in the history of drama."

Themes grew clearer with every reading, the meaning of the work slowly unfolded upon us, until sympathy and love enabled us to feel the heart-throbs of the author through their musical notation. And Elgar's symphony is not Beethoven's 'Ninth,' meant in the history of music. Only those very superficial persons who can comprehend 'Hamlet' at one reading, will question the advisability of playing the 'Ninth' twice in the same evening.

A SOCIALIST SERMON.

THE CRIME OF NEGLECT OR THE EVIL OF LAISSEZ-FAIRE.

Sermon in the Parkside Church, Lenox road, near Flatbush avenue, Sunday, March 7, by Rev. John D. Long, D. D. general secretary of the Christian Socialist Fellowship.

Text. "How shall we escape if we neglect so great salvation?" The Rev. Charles Stehle, secretary of Church and Labor for the Presbyterian denomination...

The text asks, "How shall we escape if we neglect so great salvation?" Some of our good friends would say that this salvation is purely individual.
