ABANDONMENT CASES BAFFLE MAGISTRATES

Unemployed Held for Non-Support—Must Pay or Go to Workhouse—Comic-Tragic Scenes. "All those who want to see the magistrate, come up, Ladies first."

When the bridegroom made this announcement yesterday in Yorkville Court, eleven women responded. They all had stories to tell to which Magistrate Corrigan listened with an assumed earnestness.

There were also several examinations on the same charge. Some of these cases were sad and some were comic. The husbands were paroled on the promise that they will give to their wives a part of their earnings.

The law strictly states that a man must support his wife and children or go to the workhouse—and the law must be enforced.

The woman then told her story. She is supported by her children. She has \$250 of her own, and this is gone; she made a plea for \$3 a week.

"What have you to say to this?" demanded the magistrate. Morgan is a tall Irishman of about thirty-five, and of the untidy kind.

"No Work, Your Honor." James Mooney and his wife came next. Mrs. Mooney looked pale, but was neatly dressed, she told the usual story of abandonment and non-support.

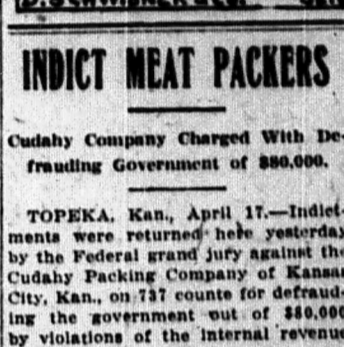
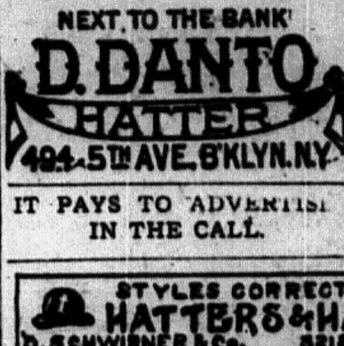

CHAPTER X. THE SECOND STAGE OF THE GOULD FORTUNE.

The first medium by which Jay Gould transferred many millions of dollars to his ownership was by his looting and wrecking of the Erie Railroad. If physical appearance were to be accepted as a gauge of capacity, none would suspect that Gould contained the elements of one of the boldest and ablest financial marauders that the system in force had as yet produced.

Private Concoction of the Erie Railroad.

The Erie Railroad running from New York City to Buffalo was started in 1832. In New York State alone, it received what was virtually a gift of \$3,000,000 of state funds, raised by public taxation, and \$2,217,000 in gifts from municipalities and towns through which it passed.

Confound in the fact promises of its promoters, the people credulously supposed that their interests would be safeguarded. But from time to time legislation after legislation was corrupted or induced to enact stealthy acts by which the railroad was made the possession of a small clique of exploiters and speculators.

The Speculator, Drew, Gets Control.

Not satisfied with the thefts of public funds, the successive cliques in control of the Erie Railroad continually plundered its treasury, and decided its stockholders' little attention was given to efficient management that shocking catastrophes resulted at frequent intervals.

So pronounced a victory was this considered for Vanderbilt, that the price of Erie stock went up thirty cents. In the meantime, however, a cunning trick in respect to obeying Vanderbilt's order, they had wrenched away the books of stock from a messenger boy summoned ostensibly to carry them to a deposit place on Pine street.

Gould and His Partners Flee With Millions.

It was not until the day's activity was over that Vanderbilt, amazed and furious, realized that he had been gouged out of \$7,000,000. Other buyers were also cheated out of millions. The old man had been caught napping. He was this fact which stung him most.

Vanderbilt Ousts Drew, Then Restores Him.

The change worked with Vanderbilt's habitual brusque ostentatiousness. Drew apparently was crushed. He had, however, one final resource, and this he now used with historic effect. In tears he went to Vanderbilt and begged him not to turn out the old, self-made man like himself.

with the comforting and self-sufficient explanation that they had done to Vanderbilt precisely what he had done to others, and would have done to them. But it was not with themselves that the squaring had to be done.

Gould Bribes the Legislature with \$500,000.

Stuffed \$500,000 in his satchel, Gould surreptitiously hurried to Albany. Detected there and arrested, he was released under heavy bail which a confederate supplied.

Alliance with Corrupt Politics and Judiciary.

From 1858 to 1872 Gould, abetted by subservient directors, issued 235,000 shares of Erie stock. The shares were made up commonly by having the Tweed machine as an auxiliary.

It was largely by means of his corrupt alliance with the Tweed 'ring' that he was able to push through his gigantic frauds from 1858 to 1872.

Gould was indeed, the unquestioned master mind in these transactions; and the others merely executed his directions. The various fraudulent devices were of Gould's original invention.

The Legislature Bribed Again.

It includes the entire amount, including the large fees paid to agents and lawyers corruptly expended by the Erie stockholders in ousting Gould, was \$750,000. Did they foot this bill out of their own pockets?

Gould's Trading Class Support.
