INDIAN WORKER INSPECTS U. S. Representative of Workmen's Union of Bombay Traveling in This Country for Information.

CHICAGO, Ill., June 8.—Talachcar, special representative of the Indian Workingmen's Association of Bombay, India, arrived in Chicago last week from San Francisco.

On the Pacific coast he visited Vancouver, Seattle, Portland, Ogden and San Francisco. There are 10,000 Indian laborers on the Pacific coast, the majority of whom are centered in Vancouver.

The English government has watched Talachcar closely in his investigations and has attempted to put obstacles in his way.

Cotton Chief Industry. The chief industry in India is the manufacture of cotton goods, employing about 211,000 operatives.

Taking into consideration the 145,000 mill operatives in Bombay and the operatives in Lancashire, England, it is found that the proportion for 1,000 spindles is 30 to 4.2.

The annual output of the two competing districts in yarn is 7,736 pounds for Lancashire and 3,700 pounds for Bombay.

The average working hours per week for each operative is fifty-five and one-half hours in Lancashire and eighty hours in Bombay.

The wages per month in Lancashire are 81 rupees, says the Indian representative; in India, 13 rupees.
