WOMAN'S SUFFRAGE BILL IS HELD UP Senator Newcomb Fails to Appear and Measure Not Up for Debate.

ALBANY, March 17.—Because Senator Josiah T. Newcomb did not attend a meeting of the senate Judiciary committee the "votes for woman" bill was not reported out for debate in the senate today.

Senator Newcomb favors suffrage, as does Mrs. Newcomb. He introduced one of the suffrage bills now before the legislature.

Senator Stillwell's suffrage measure was under consideration in an executive meeting of the Judiciary committee yesterday. On the motion to report the measure favorably the committee divided evenly. Senator Newcomb was absent.

If he had been present he undoubtedly would have voted in the affirmative, and the suffrage bill would come up on the floor of the senate for debate.

This is the second severe disappointment the suffragists have suffered this session. Previously Chairman A. J. Levy and members of the assembly Judiciary committee rejoiced into believing that that committee would report their bill. Then Senator Bayne, chairman of the senate committee, gave them most optimistic assurances, only to disappoint them later.
