OSBORN BUILDING IS ANOTHER FIRE TRAP

Structure at 44 Hubert Street Menace to Life. 600 ARE IN DANGER

Fire Escape; Full of Inflammable Material; Workers in Dread.

More than 2,000 workers, the majority of them girls, employed in various binery, printing and box shops located in the Osborn Building, an eleven-story "fire-trap" building at 44-46 Hubert street, are daily exposed to a catastrophe like that of the Triangle Waist shop where 146 girls lost their lives a few weeks ago.

Employees most in danger are those working for the following concerns: Interlock Publishing Company, occupying fourth, sixth and seventh floors, employs about 600 girls. The binding and mailing department of the Interlock concern is located in the lower building.

In your letter of the 14th inst., you published a letter from the president of the Francisco Ferrer Association, to which I deem it my duty to reply. The true facts are these:

On my assuming the organization I found the following state of affairs: An empty treasury, \$400-\$500 debts, high running expenses, practically no income, certificate money used up, friction between the executive and the membership, no trace of Ferrer branches "all over the country," only about 100 members (and all had not paid their dues), the greatest confusion regarding the aims of the association, dense ignorance regarding educational matters (I was savagely attacked, for instance, for not including anarchism and other issues in the future curriculum of the day school), and also the deplorable custom of "passing the hat," which was thinning out the audience.

I succeeded in stopping the begging, expenses were considerably reduced, about \$200 of the Day School fund was put back in the bank, and some debt paid. Incidentally the salary of clerk, whose services were not indispensable, was stopped.
