CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Nov. 28.—The fact that the Harvard Corporation had barred Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, the well-known English suffragist, from addressing the undergraduate body became known today, through the publication in the Harvard Crimson of a communication from Walter T. Fisher, a member of the Junior class...

SHANGHAI, Nov. 28.—The rebels rushed the Nanking fortifications today and captured the city after a desperate hand-to-hand fight in which 700 imperialists and 500 revolutionaries were killed.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28.—Wharton Barker, a banker of Philadelphia, startled members of the Senate Committee on Interstate Commerce today, when he charged that a prominent New York financier, now dead, informed him in 1904 that the financial interests had decided to support Theodore Roosevelt for President under the terms of a bargain on the railroad question.

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., Nov. 28.—A jury after deliberating only three minutes returned a verdict in the Supreme Court at White Plains today of murder in the first degree against Vincenzo Cona, one of the robbers accused of complicity in the murder of Mrs. Mary Hall at the Griffen farm house at Croton Lake on November 9 last.

Not satisfied with having kidnapped innocent men and haled them to trial for their lives; not satisfied with having been instrumental in one of the most monstrous frame-ups ever attempted in criminal history, with the object in view of taking the lives of innocent men in the hope thereby of wrecking the organizations of the workers; not satisfied with having accomplished the most monstrous crimes on the calendar, the detectives in the pay of Burns, Otis and company have now sprung yet another frame-up on the defense.

After putting Beggs on the stand, the prosecution rested its case. The judge of the institution, who were arrested by the article which is the basis for the libel action, for permitting fifty of the men convicted for robbery and peddling to mingle with prisoners sentenced for first offenses of a minor character, many of whom are mere boys, stated that the reputation of the prison was about as bad as that of all classes of prisoners taken together.

PEKING, Nov. 28.—Lieutenant-General Feng Kuo-Chang, commander of the imperial troops at Hankow, telegraphed today that he occupied the whole of the city of Han-Yang at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Wu-Chang capitulated to the imperial troops today, the revolutionary leaders expressing a desire to negotiate for a compromise and suggesting some slight alterations in the government program.

What Money King Said... 'Three or four weeks before the election in 1904' said Barker, 'I was walking down Broadway when I met one of the most distinguished money kings in New York, a man now dead. He said to me: 'We are going to elect Roosevelt. I expressed surprise and asked if he had given up the support of Parker. He replied in the affirmative; that they had frightened Roosevelt so he had made a bargain with them.'

SOCIALIST VOTE A PROTEST, HE SAYS... Governor of Minnesota Explains Big Gains of Workers' Party... CHICAGO, Nov. 28.—That the large Socialist vote at the recent elections is a 'vote of protest,' is the opinion of Governor Eberhardt, of Minnesota. Eberhardt arrived here today on 'the Governor's special,' which, carrying the chief executives of the Western States, is to tour the East.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Nov. 28.—The Burns operatives today caused the arrest of three men in the McNamara trial, alleging they were implicated in an attempt to bribe the prospective jurors in the case. The men arrested are Bert Franklin, George N. Lockwood and 'Cap' White.
