A whiff of hydrocyanic acid gas caused the instant death yesterday of Arthur H. Koelker, a young German chemist, in the William C. Lytle laboratory connected with Roosevelt Hospital. The breaking of a glass retort forming part of the apparatus in which Koelker was conducting experiments with cyanide of potassium and ferro cyanide salts released the fumes which caused his death.
