BRITISH POSTMEN THREATEN STRIKE 90,000 Men Will Tie Up Christmas Mails if Demands Are Refused.

LONDON, Dec. 15.—England is excited today over the threat of a general strike of postoffice employees in Great Britain, which would tie up the Christmas mails. The boast of the Cabinet that it had postponed the possibility was premature.

SHERIFFS WATCHING MILWAUKEE POLICE Socialist Officials to Stop Patrolmen From Lying to Taxpayers About Administration.
