The new ratio for apprentices is, in large shops, one for first five mechanics, two for ten, three for fifteen, and so on. In shops where there are less than five mechanics, one apprentice for every two mechanics. The hours have been reduced from fifty-three per week to forty-eight without a reduction in wages. A unanimous vote of thanks was given to the American Federation of Musicians for their support in pushing the Lithographers' label.
