

Racing Parry in Russia

(Our European Staff Correspondent)

MOSCOW—The Congress of the Russian Communist Party took place for the twelfth time in the presence of unusual conditions: the first leader of the party was missing. But the missing, his spirit guided the proceedings. Everything was conducted in the Light of Lenin—which has a distinct meaning at the present time.

The Twelfth Congress faced some difficult and complicated problems. War-time Communism is over and the introduction of the New Economic Policy, as a temporary adaptation to capitalism, demands greater elasticity. It was treated in a brilliant manner, and the governments suffer from lack of talent to carry on the economic life of the country. It must be noted that the rank and file of the workers themselves. The proletarian engineer, as yet to be created, he has to evolve his own method of production with forces unacquainted with the problems confronting them. The task is a tremendous one, many mistakes are made and many obstacles must be overcome. Only a rigid organization and careful selection of those placed in charge of production will ensure success.

Opposition to this position was led by Krasin, Commissar of Trade, who maintained that this process was too slow that it can be utilized as a basis for the re-establishment of Russian industry. He declared that it would secure international loans and credits. Consequently, production of the capitalist would have to be adapted to capitalist industry. This position was completely repudiated by the Congress. Soviet Russia will greet whatever international credit and loans are granted her on a self-sustaining basis. Soviet Russia cannot and will not wait till the capitalist governments consent to grant credits. This is the question of the growing power of the Soviet State.

The question of nationalities has become an immediate concern since the Union of Soviet States was effected last year. There are now about 200 different nationalities assembled under the Red Flag of the Union of Soviet Republics, all of which have their peculiar problems. Most of them are petty nationalities, yet a few of them, such as the Great Russians, have a large population. In all cases, it is a petty-bourgeois chauvinist instinct that has to be combated. There are also the problems of language, of education, and literature. They are mainly the problems of peasant life, and range from those of the nomads of the Circassian hills to the population of the broad Russian plains.

The nationalities of the only government that has given self-determination to the nationalities composing the Union, even though that was one of the great slogans with which the Allies won the war. Only the Communists can guarantee such rights since the proletarian State depends on the self-development of nations.

The Communists, as the initiator of the revolutionary movement that took the workers and peasants into power, have been responsible for the welfare of the State ever since. Moreover, the workers and the masses pressants have looked to the Communist Party for their guidance. True to their mission as a party, the Communist Party has assumed this responsibility. And yet hitherto this assumption has been in the main one. Today the responsibility is direct.

The Party has a Control Commission for controlling the work of the leading organs of the Party. This Commission holds the individuals and official bodies to the task and makes them account for their actions and decisions. It has been decided to give this Commission the duty of controlling the Soviet government. It has the authority to classify members and will have the task and responsibility of the good functioning of the government.

Right Labor Young Toolers Urge

attention of the organized as well as the unorganized workers is directed to them in a vast mass of unorganized youth exploited by capitalists.

Particularly the "many barriers" preventing the youth from entering the unions are pointed out in the letter and an endeavor to reach the workers in the unions everywhere where it was made to call their aid in opening the way to the entrance into the unions of the millions of exploited youth.

The complete text of the letter received by Gomper from the Young Workers League is as follows:
Samuel Gomper, President, American Federation of Labor, Washington, D. C.

Dear Sir and Brother—

After investigating the economic conditions of the young in this country, and after a thorough discussion of ways and means of improving these conditions, the Young Workers League of America (the organization of the young workers of the United States) instructed its National Executive Committee to submit the following statement to you to the American Federation of Labor.

Our own investigation as well as official statistics of the Children's Bureau of the United States Department of Labor show that the young workers in this country—many instances more than 90 per cent—work longer hours and for less wages than the adult workmen.

In most industries first in the eight hour day has been established by the young workers who have compelled to work nine, ten and sometimes a day. Need we tell you, Mr. Gomper, that these long hours in the steel mills where the twelve hour day is still in vogue are simply appalling, and that large numbers of young workers suffer under these horrible conditions? You must be acquainted with the work of the young workers in the mines where they labor inhumanly long hours at the most hazardous work.

Surely you have not forgotten the statement made by the Young Workers League of Europe—"America has at least two decades behind many European countries in the protection of life, health and limb of the workers." And you must realize that since then this country has still shamefully little progress, particularly in the matter of protecting the life and limb of the young workers. We specifically refer to the action of the United States Department of Labor in throwing out two national child labor laws. Your statement made in 1909 particularly refers to the fact as the young workers are concerned.

You have spoken of child labor quite often, Mr. Gomper, and the adult workers are aware of the abominable fact that over 2,000,000 children fifteen years of age and under work for their livelihood. We need not elaborate on this disgusting state of affairs. We just want to point out here, however, that the official statistics of the United States Department of Labor show that children in this country at age and under are being worked as much as fourteen hours a day.

These are the American Federalists who at the Second National Convention of the Young Workers League of America, on behalf of the young workers and child workers of this country return to the organized labor movement to find the means to remedy the conditions that exist. Our organization cannot carry on the struggle alone and isolated from the youth. Moreover, we emphatically reject the idea of special youth organizations on the economic field.

That the young workers, as part of the entire working class, can only better its conditions by joining together to shoulder with the adult workers the unanimous decision of the convention. The convention furthermore expressed its willingness to lend every possible aid to the unions for the purpose of organizing the young workers. Particular emphasis was laid upon the necessity of a united labor movement and the combating of all dualism in the industrial field.

We need not point out to you that it is not only in the interest of the young workers that we urge them in the interest of the adult workers as well. The fact is too well known for us to need to repeat that the young workers are very often used as strikebreakers to stab the adult workers on strike. Labor movement cannot let the young workers be used to reduce the standard of living of the adult workers.

It is, therefore, the imperative task of the organized labor movement to pay the greatest attention to the young workers and to enlist them in the ranks of the labor union. The young workers want to join the unions. So far, however, they have been kept out of the unions by many barriers, such as age limits, etc. A concerted effort must be made to break down these barriers and to bring within itself the great mass of unorganized youth.

We ask you to consider these questions and to devise ways and means for making it easier for the young workers to join the unions. We think it necessary that all barriers be abolished and that the gates be thrown open to all young workers willing to join the unions. All youthful toolers irrespective of their age should be admitted with full rights.

Your convention also set up an economic program and a series of demands for the young workers based on the conditions now existing. Considering the importance of this question, we call upon you, fellow workers and brothers, duly to examine our demands and to let us know at an early date what decision your committee has arrived at regarding the organization of the young workers in the unions.

We are particularly interested to hear from you what immediate steps you intend to undertake to assist the working youth in their fight against child labor, long hours in the steel and other industries, and against the conditions in the chemical and life industries, abolition of night work in industries dangerous to the health of the young workers, and for the protection of life, health and limb of the young workers and for the lead labor movement cannot let the cry of the suffering millions of children go unheeded.

Hat Effort to Deport 5 Party Heads

CHICAGO—Testimony of two department of justice undercover men have failed to accomplish the deportation of five foreign-born defendants in the Michigan red raid case. The hearing of T. J. They refused because they have not yet been tried in the Michigan court and they were not yet admitted to the Communist convention of August, 1922, which was held in Detroit.

Campaign of Militant Coal Diggers Begins to Sweep Ohio Mine Fields

Mine Workers are too intelligent to stand for the autocratic display of this circular, and its contents are being widely distributed. The coal diggers are beginning to sweep Ohio mine fields.

One of the chief grievances in Eastern Ohio has long been the slaver or stone currier who has no regard for the coal diggers' health or safety, but who is content to let them starve without pay.

Various strong rebellions against this situation have sprung up in the past, only to be quelled by the officials by statements such as the one by President Ledwith of the National Eastern Ohio Institute me. It is not necessary to say that the coal diggers are beginning to sweep Ohio mine fields.

Organization Work Demanded

Ohio, and especially the Centre and Southern fields, are suffering from the non-union conditions in the nearby West Virginia and Kentucky non-union fields. The coal diggers in Central Ohio, suffer from the shortest working time, 10 hours a day, and the lowest pay, only 21 cent of full working operation. The coal from the mines is sent to the West Virginia and Kentucky fields, where it is sold for 10 per cent to the Hoicking coal.

Denied New Trial
The case of a Labor Party in Ohio was demonstrated last week when Ventura and Agosta, under the protection of alleged conspiracy, were killed by John Majors at the end of last summer at the age of 21. A new indictment was filed by the Ohio Gov. of Appeals. No direct evidence was offered against them, but it had been active in the miners' union.
