Sacramento Jury Frees 13 of 24 in Vag. Frameup

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Aug. 29.—A great victory was won against Communist suppression today when after four weeks in court, during which time they were even denied their rights to present defense, thirteen workers were acquitted of frame-up charges of vagrancy by juries.

Among those acquitted was Carmine Decker, secretary of the United Agricultural Workers Industrial Union, against whom capitalist newspapers, cooperating with McAllister, have directed a vicious campaign of "black" propaganda, linking a "red" imaginary intrigue that reached from Moscow to Hollywood.

Eleven, however, have been found guilty on vagrancy charges and will be sentenced later, the maximum being ninety days.

Seventeen are still being held in jail on charges of criminal syndicalism, but arrangements for the charges will not be heard, it is reported, for another ten days.

101,000 Los Angeles Votes For Gallagher - Richmond Double Communist Vote

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 31.—As we go to press final reports of the election results are not yet available, but with about 2,000 precincts yet to be counted, Leo Gallagher has already scored more than 100,000 votes, by one of the biggest mass protests against the recent fascist terror against workers ever experienced.

NEW C. S. INDICTMENTS TO BE ASKED OF GRAND JURY THURSDAY

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 17.—In one of the most sweeping victories ever won in an American election, Harry Bridges carried the election in the International Longshoremen's Association here yesterday. The members, although believing the odds were against them, elected their own leaders in the strike and voted them in.

Harry Bridges won the presidency hand down, by a vote of 1,220 to 620. The only other candidate, who had been elected in the previous election, was John Holman. Holman was voted out for obstructing the first mediation proceedings previous to the strike being called off.

The victory was a strong indication of the growing sentiment in favor of industrial democracy, control and a crushing defeat to the Lewis machine which since the formation of the strike last month has tried to order the members to accept a union from the docks or build their own committee. Harry, claiming such a union would be a mere puppet, refused to do so.

That same evening a huge rally was held at the fairgrounds. The 35th Annual Convention of the California Federation of Labor has just finished at Pasadena...

In this strike the teamsters took a militant part, the rank and file again showing their solidarity with the waterfront workers.

Neither the betrayals such as the textile strike, the maritime strike, nor the steam-rolling of A. F. of L. conventions can stop the growing rank-and-file movement.

"Chelyuskin" (SOVIET RUSSIA)

When the Chelyuskin, bound for arctic exploration, sank in the arctic ice, the Soviet Union mobilized the whole country for rescue work.

Forty experienced polar aviators, four polar ships and one dirigible were put at the service of the rescue.

Whatever was needed, regardless of cost, regardless of human effort, was made available for the rescuers.

Soviet aviators even came to the United States to facilitate the rescue.

Out of 104 human lives, 103 were saved, the one dying from an accident when the ship crashed beneath the ice.

When the Fascist General Noble crashed in his dirigible near the North Pole, the Soviet Union mobilized its best forces to rescue him—and rescued him!

The red aviator Babushkin risked his life over the arctic wastes when the Fascist scientists were fighting with one another as to who shall be rescued first!

Steel Workers Earn Less The magazine STEEL for September 3 reports that from June to July the number of workers in the steel industry declined from 415,547 to 383,673.

American-Hawaiian S. S. Co. Strike Loss In July The American-Hawaiian Steamship Company reports a net loss from operations during July of \$55,416 against a net profit of \$142,575 for the same month a year ago when there was no strike.

Earnings of Sugar Beet Workers A survey by the Department of Labor published in the Monthly Labor Review of July, 1934, shows that the average family of sugar beet contract workers in 1933 earned \$312 against \$1,011 in 1924.

Real Wages Drop As Prices Increase The increase in the cost of living is shown by the report of the Bureau of Labor Statistics in the New York Times of August 30, in which wholesale food prices average 41.5 per cent higher than the low point of 1933.
