Hope of averting a nation-wide coal strike on April 1, was virtually abandoned on Monday by officers of the United Mine Workers of America. The operators have twice refused to enter into wage negotiations with any union and, as a last-ditch effort, on March 21, the miners in the entire jurisdiction of the union will lay down their picks and walk out on strike on April 1. The miners are demanding a six-hour day, a five day week and a continuation of the present wage scale. The vote on the question of a strike, April 1, unless such negotiations are opened on the basis of the miners' demands, is nine to one in favor of the strike.
