## STRIKE OF MINERS STEADILY GAINING IN NON-UNION FIELDS

### Sheriffs of Counties Controlled by Coal Interests Arrest Strike Leaders and Endorse to Launch Reign of Terror in Effort to Intimidate Miners and Force Them to Scab.

The first ten days of the nation-wide coal strike has been a continuous succession of victories for the strikers. From every part of the jurisdiction of the union the strike has continued, one hundred per cent strong and in all non-union fields thousands of men who never before belonged to any labor organization are flocking to the standard of the union. The World war, instead of being the last war, cleared the ground for ever greater wars. The United States emerged from the orgy of bloodshed as the most powerful nation financially and militarily in the world's condition. It controls most of the gold hoards of the earth and yet its resources are all too inadequate to enable it to maintain its supremacy unless it can extend its control to the oil fields of the world. The use of oil as fuel for ships, for steam engines and for industry generally has since the war constituted the world's scrambling for control of oil fields. The struggle for control of oil during the past three years has reduced the powerful Rockefeller corporation, the Standard Oil Company, to a secondary place. During this period the powerful British combination, now known as the Royal Dutch Shell, has secured

### CONFERENCE WILL FAIL TO RECONSTRUCT EUROPE

The European "economic conference" at Genoa opened Monday afternoon and at the very first session there was a clash between the Russian and French delegates over the question of disarmament, which was smoothed over by the British premier, Lloyd George, who considers the conference his personal creation.

### First Arrests in Coal Strike

Last week the first arrests of union officials and organizers were made in Westmoreland county and Indiana county, Pennsylvania, where over 7,000 non-union miners were persuaded to strike. The sheriffs of these counties hold their offices only by virtue of their remaining willing tools of the corporations and have been cut and State Police had been called out to "impose strikers' order" on the non-union men to leave their work.

### Pennsylvania

Disorders in the Western Pennsylvania coal districts were reported Friday morning when the authorities stated, high tension electric wires carrying current for mines had been cut and State Police had been called out to "impose strikers' order" on the non-union men to leave their work.

The Fayette County field, which includes the important Connellsville coke region, has long been looked upon as the non-union mining stronghold of Western Pennsylvania, and particular efforts are being made by the United Mine Workers to unionize it.

Four important plants of the H. C. Frick Company, the coal subsidiary of the United States Steel Corporation, and five independent plants were listed today as closed by union activities.

In every section of Pennsylvania, hitherto considered hopelessly non-union, the organizers of the miners are conducting big drives. Thousands are being reached by the organizers and other thousands leave their employment voluntarily, so that the entire work of organization took the most part consists of keeping a large enough supply of application cards on hand to sign up those anxious for membership in the union.

### United States Steel Hit

The nation-wide strike has resulted in already cutting down by half the amount of steel being produced by the non-union fields. There will be developed gigantic mines without the assistance of capital, except that small amount supplied by their labor.

## Semenoff Murderer and Robber, Says Col. Morrow

Charging that Gen. Semenoff is cowardly and unscrupulous, "murderer of innocents," and that as a murderer and robber he is the greatest monster of all times, Col. Charles H. Morrow of Kentucky, secretary of the anti-Bolshevik leader in Siberia, Gen. Morrow, who was in command of American troops in Siberia during the war, has recommended some of Semenoff's acts. He said that one night, when the thermometer was 63 below zero, Semenoff sent an armored train to the station of Poudkoye and attacked an American camp, killing five of the soldiers and wounding many others. The raiders finally were routed by the Americans.

already too late. The British combination had grabbed up such vast fields in every part of the world that everywhere the Standard Oil turned it down the way blocked by the Royal Dutch Shell. Each of these giants of the oil world has numerous subsidiaries and there are reports to the effect that some of the so-called American competitors of the Standard Oil of New Jersey are backed by British and French financiers.

Negotiations with the Persian government for petroleum concessions initiates that government into the whirlpool of world imperialism as it is manifested in the scramble for oil. The West Indies Oil Company, a subsidiary of Standard Oil and the Anglo-Persian Oil Company, a British concern, are making the so-called diplomats of Persia dizzy trying to pacify both concerns. Each concern tries to intimidate the helpless government of Persia. The government was on the verge of granting a concession to the Standard Oil concern when the British company stepped in and, on the claim of a prior concession to the privilege of the property, halted further negotiations. The British government is intensely interested in British control of the world's oil supply, so it has voted the appropriate \$4,000,000 to support the fight of the Anglo-Persian concern against the Standard.

The capitalist press of the United States is howling that Great Britain should pay her war debts to the United States instead of spending millions to fight American oil concerns. They forget that treaties and obligations are always scraps of paper in the struggle for world supremacy and that economic needs overshadow everything else. Britain needs oil in order to carry on her industries and in a larger sense in order to have a comparative measurable supply of fuel for her navy in the next war, that she is already preparing for. The United States needs oil for the same purposes. The struggle for oil in Persia is merely an incident in the world-wide struggle for supremacy in this field.

### Standard Oil in Argentine

The Standard Oil Company of New Jersey is planning the formation of the Standard Oil Company of Argentina for an extensive development program. The corporation has acquired a large acreage under lease, has a crew of geologists in the field and is going ahead with its search for oil. Through a subsidiary, the West Landa Oil Company, the Standard Oil of New Jersey already is active in the Argentine.

## MORE POWER

### Workers in Rhode Island Holding Firm While Lawrence Strike Gains Power From Day to Day.

The strikers in Rhode Island, who have been out since January, are holding their ranks intact and the entire industry in that section is at a standstill. There are no new developments this week, at the time of going to press with this publication. There is a marked gain in the strike in Lawrence, Mass., where all the mills with the single exception of the American Woolen Mills concerns are out. The American Woolen Mills has not yet participated in the attempt to cut wages, which was the cause of the strikes in other mills.

At the Pacific Mills in Lawrence there was a slight disturbance on Thursday of last week when a number of scabs attempted to leave the mills and a fight ensued with a number of strikers. The next day when the closing hour came at the Pacific Mills, not a worker came out past the picket lines. Police explained that mill officials has sent all the workers home in the afternoon at intervals so as to avoid a repetition of the disorders. Strike leaders declared that the mill operators took this action because not enough workers were coming to work to permit them to run any department.

When the lower Pacific Mills opened in the morning only twenty-eight workers of the 2,500 normally employed went to work. Numbers ranging from 300 to 500 had been working at these mills during the last few days.

Officials of the Pacific Mills said tonight that they would not close the mills, but would keep the gates open, regardless of the number of workers reporting. They admitted serious losses at the Pacific plant today.

Condition at the other mills affected by strikes were unchanged, only a small percentage of operatives answering the whistles.

and the strikers was immediately under way. Then Lloyd George made a speech wherein he indicated considerable of his talk before the lower house of British parliament last week. Nothing is changed in his attitude as far as fundamentals are concerned. He still considers the liquidation of paper currency the keynote to the solution of Europe's economic ills. To stabilize currency between all countries is his panacea for the immediate situation in Europe, and that he actually takes his own position seriously is evident from the vehement manner in which he constantly attacks this part of the program of the conference. It must be rather amusing to some of the Russian delegates, who are Marxist, to hear this complete economic hoax expounded by the individual regarded by capitalist Europe as "the world's foremost statesman."

In the agenda drawn up as the guide of the conference the question of Russia is to be considered after all other problems of European finance and economic rehabilitation have been solved. This maneuvering was a ploy to the French government, which is quite pessimistic about the outcome of Genoa. The whole thing resolved itself into a farce from the very moment the agenda was drawn up, consigning the Russian question to a minor place in the scale of negotiations. The one question that is of paramount importance is the question of an agreement whereby the vast natural resources and raw material of Russia could be applied to Western European industries. The question of currency, of stabilization of credit and every other question on the agenda is as nothing compared to the question of Russia. Lloyd George, the representative of British imperialism, has endeavored for nearly three years to get a conference of European nations, whereby the vast resources of Russia could be used to help Europe out of her muddle. The chauvinist elements of Britain, aided by the French representative of British imperialism, have been able to prevent such a conference. It was not the persuasiveness of Lloyd George that prevented Europe of the necessity of the conference, but the complete economic collapse of Europe.

The conflict of interests between France and England is based upon the desire of France to obtain hegemony over Europe, while yielding to English imperialism. The desire of the world, desirable as that sort of agreement would be to Lloyd George, experience has taught him and the class he represents that will not work. To stabilize economic conditions

UNITED TOLLERS ACTIVE IN STRIKE

Issue Paper Called 'Miners' Voice' That May Be After Immediate Release of Prisoners in Pennsylvania

The United Tolders of America is carrying on intensive educational and agitation work among the striking miners in Pennsylvania, by issuing a publication known as the 'Miners' Voice.' The paper is to be published twice a week and is to be distributed to every miner in the striking mine. The first number was issued the day after the strike broke out in Pennsylvania.

The interests made in the ranks of the non-miner miners, who are flocking to the ranks of the United Mine Workers of America in a small degree due to the incessant propaganda of the groups of the United Tolders, who from the first have taken a stand in the front ranks of the struggle and are giving their reason for doing so.

A constructive criticism of the acts of the miner's union officials in their attitude toward the agitator is winning large numbers of workers to the movement for rank and file control of the organization, and so that the agitator can reach agreements with the enemies of labor, dual to the wishes of the miners.

LAWRENCE TEXTILE STRIKE

It seemed to me that he knew what he was talking about. He had no time for some words about the life of Jesus Christ.

The author of these lines would most respectfully suggest to the eminent committee of 7 clergymen, that they should not allow the steps of their alleged master, take the side of the weak and oppressed, and send them to the heaven side rich. I would most humbly suggest the following resolutions for the churches: 1-Child-labor, gradual physical and moral murder. 2-Low wages as cause of crime, prostitution and break-up of the workers' families. 3-Camel's chances of walking through the eye of a needle or could the rich snark into the Kingdom of Heaven?

With pictures of hell-fire and eternal damnation they may succeed in convincing some of the mill-owners. At least it will do no harm to empty stomachs. There are no strike funds and no strike benefits can be paid. But if the churches keep their promise to support the strikers, they will lose still more their influence on the workers.
