

Police Thugs of Chicago Beat Strikers For Hours To Get Fake Confessions

Charges of Murder Placed Against Four Men After Alleged "Confessions" Were Obtained Through Vicious Blows Struck by Delegates of Michigan Central Police Force, Aided by Chicago Police Thugs

HELD FOR MICHIGAN CENTRAL BAGGAGE TRAIN WRECK

After Obtaining "Confessions" Men Were Turned Over to Steel Trust Police of Gary, Indiana, Where Frame-Up Will Be Perfected; Prisoner Shows Evidence of Beating Administered in Order to Extort "Confession" From Him

The labor-hating, union smashing crusaders for the "Open Shop" and 100% Americanism, have attempted another frame-up in hopes of hanging men and striking terror into the hearts of other workers in order to destroy the organization of labor.

Last week the police-force of Chicago, assisted by private detectives employed as guards by the Michigan Central Railroad, arrested four men charging them with murder in connection with the wreck of the Michigan Central baggage train, which occurred on the double track between Chicago and Detroit, near Gary, Indiana, two weeks ago.

The reptile press of the city of Chicago, particularly the Tribune, the American and the News, carried phantasmic stories of the wreck and the confessions of murder by the arrested men.

The information on which the arrests were made is said to have been obtained from a person whose name will not be revealed, but who will receive the \$5,000 reward offered for the apprehension of the wreckers. The informant implicated persons named Alexia, who is said to have overheard a plot to wreck the train. Alexia was immediately arrested and is said to have confessed and implicated four others. They are Charles Laska, a machanic, and striking shopman of the New York Central lines; John Berkowsky, also a New York Central striker; James Probst, a car repairer, also New York Central; and one "Doc" Jones, first of the police say, and implicated Alexia. Berkowsky is also said to have confessed that he participated in the wreck.

The men were brought to Gary, where they were held by railroad detectives. Chicago and Gary police to "keep" the crime.

People who saw the performance of Laska in all the things accompanying the men, suddenly threatened him with beatings and frequently struck him in order to keep him talking.

Finally, after previous beatings at the hands of the officials the men were lodged in the Gary jail. The officials of the striking men's organization immediately engaged Paul R. Glaser, of Gary, to defend the accused strikers.

New York Labor Fakirs Are Opposed to Trade Union Educational League

Injunction Forbids Use of Union Funds For Strike and Prevents Picketing

The vicious injunction issued against the striking shopmen at the labor of the corporation Duesey arrangement of the labor-hating Harding administration is designed to prevent the strikers and their leaders from:

1. Using union funds to carry on the strike, they are preventing relief for suffering strikers.
 2. Picketing or in any way endeavoring to induce strikers to go to become hangers on by quitting their ordinary occupations.
 3. Holding strike meetings.
 4. Issuing statements to newspapers dealing with the conduct of the strike.
 5. Directing the strike by letter, telephone, newspaper statements, or in any other way "inciting any strikers, requests, public statements or resolutions to any defendant or to any official member of any of the associated labor organizations with reference to their conduct while they are on strike."
- The other provisions that will impinge even a petty propaganda nature, created in the spirit of Daugherty and the "open shop" who own the Harding administration.

- Here are some of the points that are used for public consumption and are of a purely propaganda nature, in order to conceal the real motive behind the conspiracy of the Harding administration to smash every vestige of organized labor:
1. Interference with or obstructing any railway.
 2. Withholding the inspection, repair or equipment of locomotives or cars.
 3. Conspiring or agreeing to hinder the railroads in the transportation of passengers, property and the mails.
 4. Interfering with employees going to or returning from work by days of leave or numbers, strikes, intimidation, acts of violence, apprehensions, arrests, rears, suits or threats.
 5. Loitering or near places of ingress or egress for employees.
 6. Doing any injury or bodily harm to any employee of a rail road whether at work or going to and from his home.
 7. Obstructing the operation of trains in any manner, directly or indirectly.

Russia Strikes If France Wabs Ruhr---Trotsky

Bolshevik War Minister Takes Rap At Hughes and Declares Dictatorship Must Continue Until Capitalism Is Definitely Defeated.

Leon Trotsky, Bolshevik Minister of War in the Soviet Government of Russia, recently submitted to an interview with correspondents of various newspapers throughout the world and reaffirmed the determination of the Soviet government to preserve its revolutionary integrity.

Trotsky declared that the army of the Soviet government has been reduced from 5,500,000 to 800,000, and that the government stood ready and willing to enter into a disarmament conference with any large nation, such as the United States, but would propose disarmament.

Although he did not mention any immediate intervention in the Ruhr district by the French government, Trotsky let it be known that he considers such an attack always possible and declares that Russia would not remain passive in such an eventuality.

At France, by invading the Ruhr, and by the assistance of Hind, precipitated a new European chaos, do you think Russia could remain passive?" he was asked, and his reply was "I doubt it."

"If the occasion can for a revolution in Germany," M. Trotsky said, "Russia shall breathe it tomorrow."

New York District Leaders Issue Defiant Statement While Samuel M. On that day Attorney General Harry M. Daugherty appeared before Federal Judge James M. Wilkinson in the United States District Court and, after indulging in a typical "open shop" harangue against the striking shop men and against organizing labor in general, obtained a temporary injunction which is the most drastic ever issued against a labor union in the United States.
