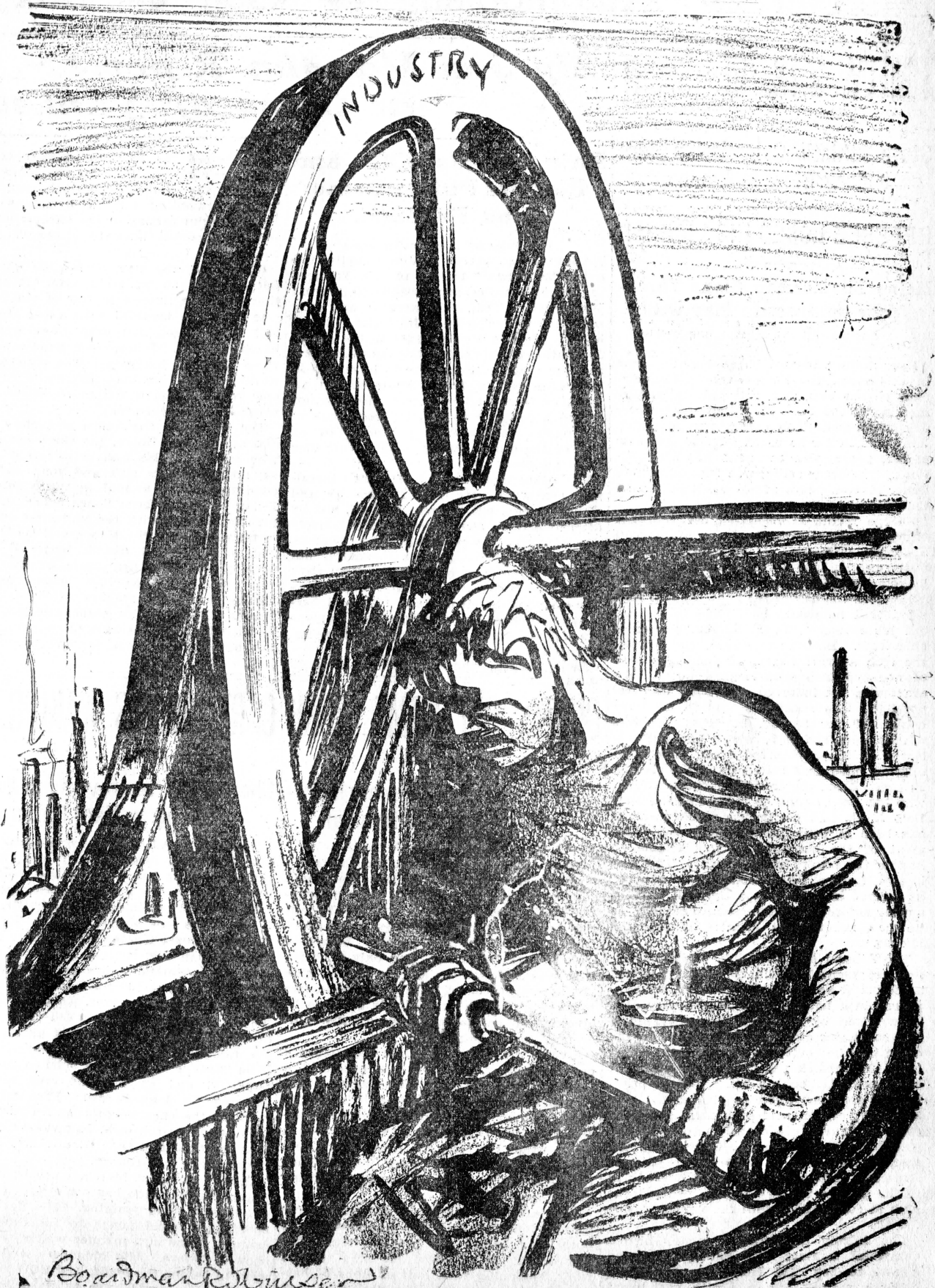


PROGRESS OF SUFFRAGE IN ENGLAND.

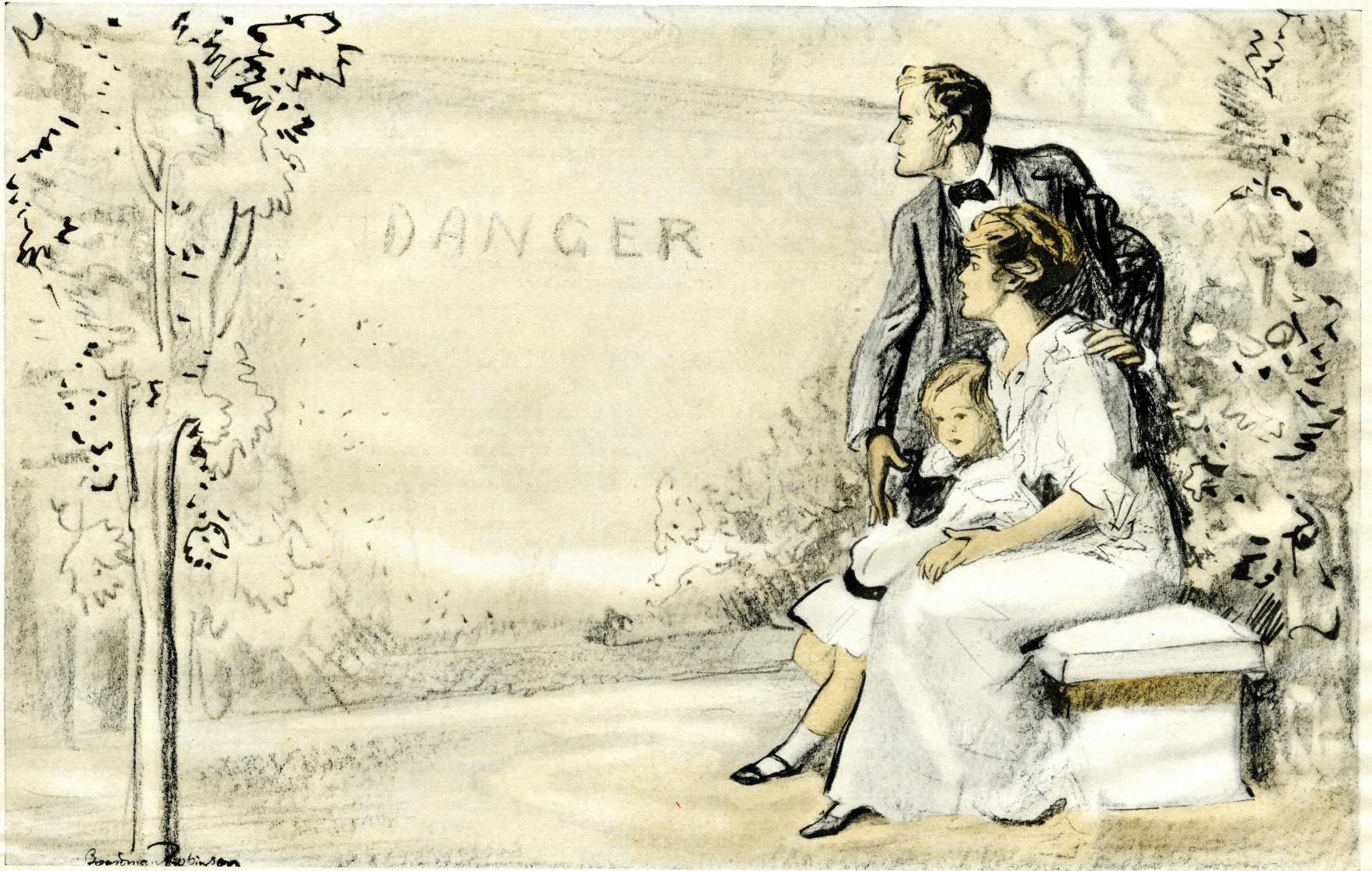

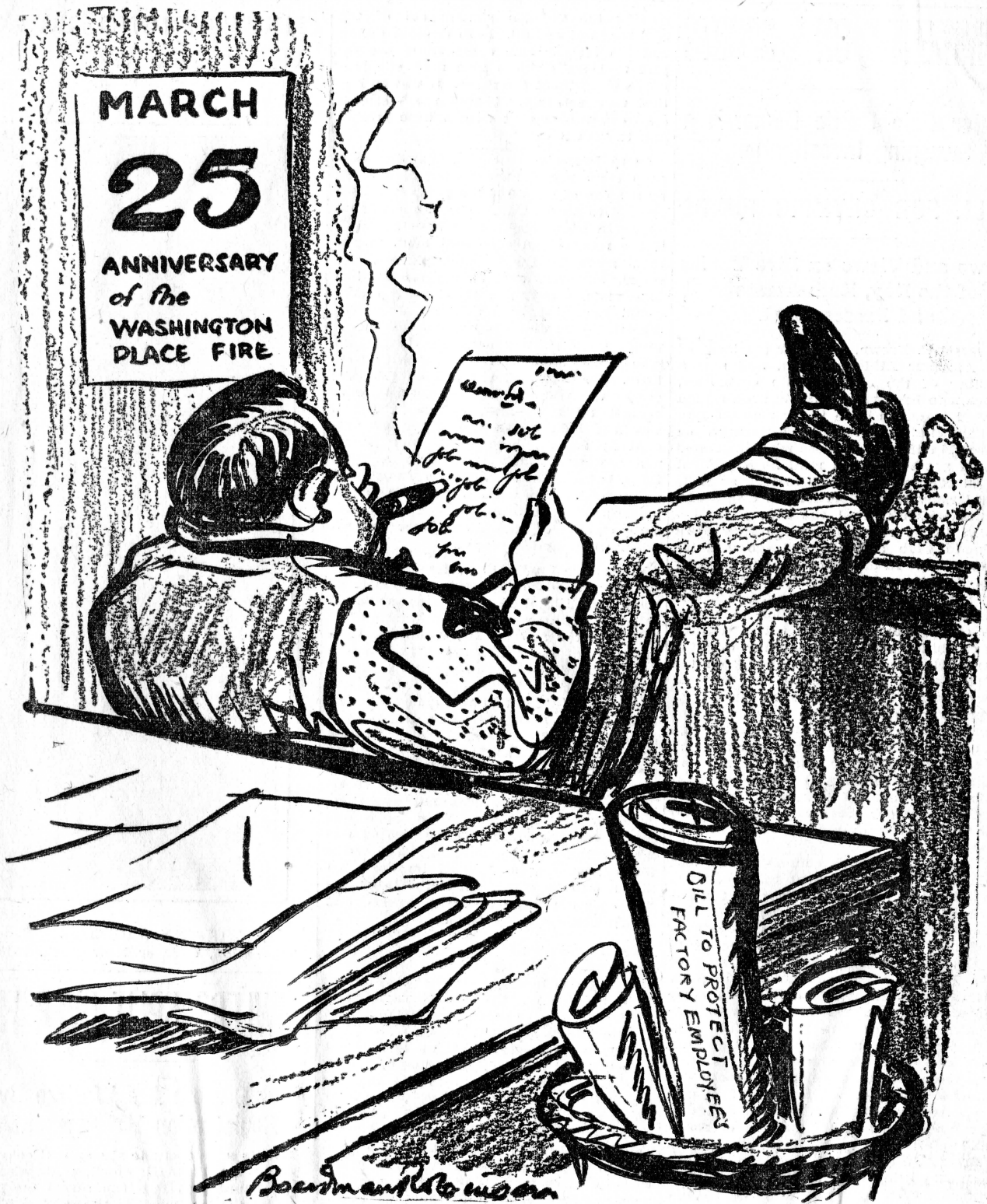
