COMMUNIST PARTY'S APPEAL

The British Imperialists alone are our enemies, enemies of us all. All freedom-loving Indians are our brothers, despite our differences.

Our appeal—to every true Indian is turn your backs finally on the hated oppressive British rulers, face like men all the problems that we have among ourselves and launch the final battle for Indian freedom which shall enter into no truce, which shall know no withdrawals and which shall be whole-heartedly joined and enthusiastically supported by every section of the Indian peoples as the battle for their own freedom, without any buts and ifs, without any fear of the British and without any suspicions against each other.

THE Communist Programme for Indian freedom is based on:

- burning hatred of British rule
- true principles of freedom
- faith in the bonafides of every Indian.

Congressmen!

The Communist Party appeals to all its CONGRESS brothers:

As long as you think that all those who are not with the Congress are against the country, you are not heading for the final freedom-struggle but closing your eyes to the living reality and after the elections are over, all Indians will have to witness the shame of another Simla Conference.

Why should it be at all difficult to see that if the leaders of the Congress do not take the initiative to solve the country's internal difficulties they will have to appeal to Lord Wavell again to act as the Leader.

Why should Congressmen, oldest of all Indian patriots, forget that through the policy of 'divide and rule,' the British conquered India, through it they have ruled over our land for 200 years, through it they propose to stay here longer.

Leaguers!

The Communist Party appeals to all LEAGUE brothers:

As long as you think that your struggle is against both the Hindus and the British, you will have to undergo the shame of appealing to the foreign British Government to divide India and give you Pakistan.

Did the British come to India, are they in India to-day, to be just to the Muslims, or indeed, to any section of our people?

All that they can promise or ever give, is a Muslim Dominion under the British suzerainty, which will neither be an independent Pakistan nor have a People's Raj within, but will only be a puppet State under the leadership of British-made knights, toady Khan Bahadurs, and oppressive jagirdars and bloated profiteers.

Against Enemy's Plan

The Communist Party declares that the Constitution-making-body outlined in the Cripps proposals, reiterated by the British Government and explained by Lord Wavell, will be a bogus Constituent Assembly, not even based on adult franchise.

It is an Imperialist trap for staging another Simla Conference and parading Indian differences before the entire freedom-loving world.

It is the Imperialist trick to keep the final say about the coming Indian Constitution in their own hands, impose a British-manufactured Constitution on us all and palm it off as the best possible practical solution in the present circumstances.

The blue-print of such a plan is already in the Cowpland Plan, the division of India into Pakistan, Hindustan and Princeland, all three as nominally independent

dominions, but all three separately and together under British influence under a weak Agency centre.

Such a plan must be foisted at all costs. Such a common calamity can and must be averted here and now. This is the foremost concern of the Communist Party today.

People's Plan

Against the British plan the Communist Party offers a truly Indian plan.

Unlike the leaderships of the Congress and the League which

They shall create, by mutual consent and through fraternal negotiations, the constitutional structure of Free India by defining and laying the foundation of Independent India as a willing Union of autonomous sovereign bodies as our Party desires, or two sovereign Federations living in friendly alliance as the League leadership proposes, or as a willing Union of autonomous but not sovereign provinces as the Congress leadership demands.

All the three solutions are possible and the final judgment shall lie with the peoples themselves.

THIRDLY, these seventeen national Constituent Assemblies shall be elected by universal adult franchise and from the seventeen homelands of Indian peoples, viz., Baluchistan, Pathanland, Sindh, Western Punjab, Central Punjab, Hindustan, Rajasthan, Gujerat, Maharashtra, Karnatak, Andhra, Kerala, Tamilnad, Orissa, Bengal, Assam, Bihar, on the basis of the redemarcation of the boundaries of the existing artificially-made British provinces.

FOURTHLY, the Communist

The Communist Party offers a truly patriotic and really practical plan, which embodies the just aims of both the Congress and the League, and which is capable of fulfilling the moment the freedom-loving masses behind the Congress and the League, and those who are unattached, will it and their respective leaderships give up hopes of striking a deal with the British Government over the heads of the others.

The Communist Party shall most widely popularise and its elected legislators shall demand the following:

FIRST, the new legislatures refuse to elect delegates to the bogus anti-democratic British-proposed constitution-making body.

Instead, they must demand from the British Government a real Constituent Assembly to which they must transfer all power and which shall draft the Quit India treaty or face the British Government with the final struggle for power.

SECONDLY, such an all-India body shall consist of delegates elected by seventeen sovereign national Constituent Assemblies.

Party will campaign for and support the immediate and simultaneous application of the principle of self-determination to the peoples of Indian States as well.

This will enable them to find their true place in the camp of the struggling Indian peoples and smash the dream of the British Imperialists to use Princely India as their hardly-veiled permanent abode inside our country to keep us all under their permanent domination and in perpetual division.

The Communist Party seeks to give clear and unequivocal expression in the above plan to the following urgent aims:

- Immediate Indian freedom from British domination.
- Right of all Indian peoples to their constitution of freedom.
- Right of all Indian peoples to full sovereignty.

There are only two courses open: either freedom-loving Indians agree among themselves about the shape and structure of Indian freedom or leave it to the British Government to exploit our differences and impose its own plans in new forms of Indian slavery.

THE FREEDOM WEEK MUST BE THE GREATEST SALES DRIVE EVER CONDUCTED BY THE PARTY NOT ONLY IN ENGLISH ALONE, BUT YOUR OWN LANGUAGE AND FOR ALL LANGUAGES.

Sell Your Maximum

It is for the first time that we are putting out literature for mass consumption and not merely for the middle class public.

Before you begin the drive, by the 10th of January, see that all those who should be all ready to sell during the drive and spend the money in advance. The aim is not to punish any comrade but to help him out.

Listen to the distribution of the booklet and make them, from the advertisements of the best and popular items. (You will get a separate circular on this matter later on 1946).

Look up all the new publications that are likely to reach you in time. The stock you have with you to be cleared up and the stock you must order from the Provincial Publishing House and from Bombay.

Send notes to both. If you write by mail you will get nothing in time. The P.P.H. will send nothing on credit but only on V.P.P. if you do not send the cash in advance.

Collect Your Maximum

It must be the maximum. Every penny collected must be made by this party.

See that all Party members and militants who have not yet paid their individual dues do so.

See that every Party member makes collections from those he knows in his own neighbourhood and place of work.

All known and respected Party comrades must go out to squads for three days in the week at least of the Freedom Week to make collections in their own villages, in the most natural form that is natural for their class and their area.

Make collections even in every market. In these markets the most loyal and respected Party and mass leaders must make a roving appeal from their seats for paying to the Party, all that everybody can pay on the spot and for period over when they go back home to their own villages or houses, where workers and employees get their wages in February and when the amounts have not been withheld. Hence the moment they get the cash in hand.

In February rallies, the slogan will be: 'Cash to the Printing Press to vote, pay one anna for the Khan Bahadur if you have not yet become a member and bring another one anna for the Party Fund as your donation. One anna for the peasants and four annas for the workers. This support you must make to every worker and peasant wherever a single Communist lives.'

In every mass meeting, bookstalls must be organized with books that will sell in the particular locality. Party leaders must attend to the bookstalls and buy. Arrangements must be made of the books available in a manner that will make the audience read by the walls. Bookstalls must be on the line of the market or in the open air and it is useless for the new period.

It should be the endeavour of every District Secretary to place work in a manner as to break through the center-Party organization, activate the comrades and get them working for the welfare.

Comrades in district meetings should sell literature, make collections, send members for more organizations and see that the D.C. or the mass leaders help them to tackle all the problems that are cropping up on the Khan Bahadur and Trade Union fronts, especially the latter.

In The Minor Districts

It is the minor districts that are lagging behind the work in the Party Fund drive. They must see that every Party member and sympathizer, even though he has a strong job, goes through in this week, collects from his family, his own contacts and makes a drive to collect from the people whom he has organized and served.

It is from them that their P.C. agents must come because the major districts are all over the place and the work is done in January and the more literature they will be able to order for February; and if they fail to do this, they will find by the time the stations are over, their agents will be in a similar plight.

On the basis of every one, start from your own village with your own ideas, order or non-order for the work. Start to show the strength of the people, show the power and indignation against the Church, show the desire for unity to all the members of India.

THE FRIENDS OF ALL WORKERS AND RAILERS IN OUR ORGANIZATION, SOME OF THEM MAY BE IN THE MINDS OF THE PARTY, BUT WE MUST REMEMBER THAT WE CAN DO THE BEST WORK.

Remember, how to get by the Party Fund, and get live a normal life.

*Give every comrade a job that he can do and not just get a job that is going out for which you are not interested.

*Make no paper plans but draw up plans that you can carry out and personally lead.

Otherside of the Unit Secretaries will find themselves working busily and not being the respect of their own mass. The Party Unit will become the leader of the village or factory but their demagoguing will be.

There is an organized Party and if its D.C. leaders cannot keep their team going, inspired and inspiring others and do not personally know all the difficulties and problems of their area, instead of finding a way out, they will all become only instructions given and then our work will stop and Party grow. The staff will not be in the hands but of our own leaders, instead of being organized and inspired. They will become instructions-givers and demagogues.

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In Our Constituencies

The biggest mass mobilisation must be achieved to bear the Election Manifesto that must be read out in every single meeting.

Meetings should be held on the basis of one rally in every area where there is no election booth and another rally with intensive door-to-door work in the areas where local campaigning through squads and houses to house visits.

The last of the speakers should give the slogan.

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Before and after the meeting arrangements must be made about where the comrades are sitting and where the people that must go to the meeting without going through the usual and meeting the leaders and organizers of the Trade Union or Khan Bahadur.

The Squad should be effective and efficient and go out on a 15-day tour reaching the people, inspiring the comrades and coming back to the district headquarters, at the end of the week, with all the literature and plenty of cash collected and then plan their work for February on the basis of their own experience gained in January.

At the best, in the individual villages or the mohalla or the bazaar, all comrades, i.e., rank and file, should work just what they like among their own contacts and sympathizers.

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BIHARIS DOING WELL HYDERABADIS TOO

Reports Must Be In By January 15

THE peasants of Bihar, among the poorest of our country, have been in the forefront of our national struggles. Who has not heard of Champaran whose peasantry in the early days after the First World War, launched the first Satyagraha Movement under Gandhiji's leadership? Who does not remember the militant anti-zemindari struggles waged here during the period of the Congress Ministries?

Today again it is the kisans who have come forward at the call of the Party, to pay for the Election Fund. As the news that KARYANANDJI, one of the most popular and respected leaders of the province, is standing for the Provincial Assembly has gone round, thousands of kisans have come forward to pledge all they have.

The First To Respond

General Body Meetings of the Party members and sympathisers have been held all over the province and the response has been great; their target is Rs. 40,000 by March 1, next.

The first to respond to the call was Dr. SIVSARAN. He had four bighas of land, all of which he has sold in order to give his due share to the Party Fund. When his story came to Patna, a Party sympathiser promised Rs. 5,000 and on the spot paid his first instalment of Rs. 2,000.

From The Peasants

But in Bihar, it is the kisans who are the backbone of our Party. At a meeting of the kisan workers of Lakhisarai Thana, Rs. 800 was promised.

A kisan youth of Nampur gave his watch; PRANDA, a Harijan agricultural labourer, who has only one bigha of land, gave away his only bullock for the Party Fund; when our comrade pleaded with him not to give away his only possession, quick came the reply: "Since my birth I have failed to earn my bread. But by contributing this bullock, I will really assure my bread in the future."

During the last fund drive, he and his wife had contributed her ear-rings.

Rahampur, another village in Monghyr has also come forward—with a will. At a group meeting Rs. 1,200 was promised. UPENDRA SHARMA gave Rs. 100 on the spot while four other well-to-do peasants promised Rs. 900, of which Rs. 300 has been already realised.

In Gogour village, a meeting was called for the Election Fund Drive, at which 300 kisans were present. They considered it an insult that they have to be requested to vote for their Red Flag. They promised to collect Rs. 400.

JAGDIT SINGH of Sheikhpur, contributed eight kaffas of land. Ram Kishorlal Singh, whose respect and regard for our Party and its leaders only came with our work in getting cloth to the people, paid Rs. 100 to the Party when he heard of the appeal.

The foremost of all naturally were the Communist leaders and members themselves. LAKHA LAL, bullock of the kisan movement with Sharmaji, contributed Rs. 500.

So also in Bhagalpur from where we are contesting a seat for the Provincial Assembly, at a meeting of Kisan youths, Communist workers and sympathisers, Rs. 3,000 was promised. ACELUTA-NARAYAN, a Party worker, promised to sell one bigha of his land and pay the amount towards the fund, and a sympathiser, LAL BAHADUR of Colgong promised Rs. 300.

From The Middle-Class

At Patna, at a meeting attended mostly by middle-class sympathisers of the Party, a promise of Rs. 2,000 was made. A journalist from amongst those present gave away his wedding ring for the Party.

young, has only a few middle-class contacts. However it decided to collect Rs. 500, of which Rs. 155 has already been raised.

From Miners

If Bihar is a Kisan Province, our main support among the kisans, yet here as all over India, where there are strong working-class centres, there our Party is strong too.

Giridih is a mining centre in Bihar. Badly paid and oppressed, yet the Giridih miners know that they had the Red Flag with them in all their bitter struggles for a better life.

Thirty of them promised to pay a month's Dearness Allowance of Rs. 14 each. TALO, one of the outstanding leaders of the workers promised Rs. 100 out of his Provident Fund; eighty workers gave Rs. 25 in a cate meeting. Collections varied from four to eight annas and their wages are barely Rs. 15 per month.

Hyderabad (Deccan)

In Hyderabad State, the Party though young has made big advances—in this 'backward' State, the drive has got under way.

At a meeting of Party members and sympathisers at Secun-

derabad, where the campaign was first launched, A. R. V. CHARI announced his donation of Rs. 200, NARASIMHAN a textile worker gave his cycle and Rs. 5 for the Party. A sympathiser who is very poor gave four annas. More than Rs. 350 have already been collected in this Drive.

ONKAR PRASAD and K. C. GUPTA gave Rs. 500 and Rs. 100 respectively.

YOSHADA has promised to pay Rs. 10 by saving it from her daily household expenses. While another Party member, PRAMILA TAI gave away her month's Party wage: Thus a total of Rs. 200 was collected from amongst tomen.

A Ceylon Letter

And the best news of all this week is a letter (with Rs. 150) from a sympathiser now in Ceylon. After hearing of the attack on our Party Headquarters, he wrote:

"I promised to send Rs. 100, but I am sending Rs. 150. I cannot send more. I would like to give my all to the Party, but I have to clear some debts incurred."

He read KAMALA PATHAK'S letter to JOSHI (which appeared in a previous issue) to another sympathiser who immediately gave Rs. 20 to the Party. He continues:

"The dastardly attack on our Party makes us all feel very sorry at the way the fair name of the Congress is being soiled."

He is surprised at Mahatma's silence on all these happenings.

It is good when our friends rally round in this way—for though the battle ahead is tough, we know that so long as this is the spirit with which we fight, we shall win through.

All the Party units have not sent their reports to me. I expect full reports of these collection drives as per mandatory directions of Joshi to reach me by the 2nd week of January (January 15). It should include the total quotas fixed and the total amount collected, and finally, most important of all—the amount sent.

Irish Soldier's Gift

TO HELP THE FIGHT AGAINST IMPERIALISM

"THE Irish people's battle for freedom has always been a source of great inspiration to our freedom-fighters. An Irishman in the RAF, hearing of our call, sent Rs. 100 together with a letter, saying:

"As an Irishman I can particularly understand and admire your cause and continually it reminds me of James Connolly, the great Irish national leader, who was executed for his part as military commander of our great 1916 Rebellion, which was the forerunner of our national state.

"Connolly realised the fact then not generally accepted in Ireland that it was necessary for our freedom to unite in a solid front the middle-class forces of the Irish volunteers, and Irish workers organised in the Irish Citizen Army and the Irish Transport Workers' Union. He forged this unity which was the basis of our freedom and died in leading it to victory.

"Your magnificent efforts to similarly unite all that is best in your own national movement seems to lead the clear way to freedom of your great country which will always remain in our memories as both a deadly condemnation of Imperialism and a living inspiration of the fight against injustice, national and local. May the present period of confusion soon pass and make way for the future which you strive to shape and will be better able to shape with your Daily paper.

"Connolly once wrote—'Out of all the turmoil and fighting, the Irish working-class movement has evolved, and is evolving, among its members a higher conception of mutual life, a realisation of their duties to each other and to society at large; and is thus building for the future in a way that ought to gladden the hearts of all lovers of the race.' You need only replace the word 'Irish' by 'Indian' and your own role is portrayed."
